- **acomodate:** to do a kindness or favor; to adjust (verb)
- **accumulate:** to gather or collect (verb)
- **exaggerate:** to enlarge beyond the limits of the truth; to overstate (adj)
- **excel:** to surpass or be superior (verb)
- **exclude:** to shut out or keep out (verb)
- **objective:** the goal, purpose, target (noun); not influenced by personal feelings; unbiased (adj)
- **obstacle:** something that opposes or gets in the way of something (noun)
- **consequence:** the result or outcome of something that occurred earlier (noun)
- **constant:** not changing or varying, to continue without pause (adj); something that does not or cannot change (noun)
- **context:** the set of circumstances or facts surround a particular event (noun)



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- **continuous**: uninterrupted, in an unbroken series or pattern (adj)
- **controversy**: a prolonged public dispute or argument (noun)

- **accelerate:** to cause faster or greater activity (verb)
- **acclaim:** to announce or proclaim enthusiastically (verb)
- **perceived:** taken in by the senses; detected or recognized (adj)
- **permanent:** existing perpetually; everlasting (adj)
- **persist:** to continue steadily especially in spite of opposition (verb)
- **concur:** to agree (verb)
- **confront:** to face hostility; to oppose (verb)
- **incredulous:** not willing or disinclined to believe (adj)
- **infuriate:** to make furious; enrage (verb)
- **insinuate:** to suggest or hint at slyly (verb)
- **inundate:** to flood or cover with water; to overwhelm (verb)
- **robust:** strong and healthy; sturdily built (adj)

- **audacious:** extremely bold or daring; extremely original; lively and unrestrained (adj)
- **augment:** to make larger in size (verb)
- **authority:** the power to determine; a person or people given authority (noun)
- **exceptional:** unusually excellent; not the ordinary (adj)
- **excerpt:** a passage or quote from a book, document, film (noun)
- **excruciating:** extremely painful; causing intense suffering; exceedingly elaborate (adj)
- **exemplify:** to show by example (verb)
- **confiscate:** to take, especially for public use (verb)
- **conscientious:** done according to one's inner sense of right and wrong; careful and painstaking (adj)
- **conventional:** following accepted standards (adj)
- **convey:** to take from one place to another; to communicate (verb)



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- **grapple:** to take hold of something; to engage in a struggle (verb); a hook or metal instrument used to secure something; the act of gripping as in wrestling (noun)
