Description Originally two cottages owned by Mr Lowther and Mr Baker and previous to that a third cottage at the north end which was later a barn. The Croft family owned this house from 1872 when it was known as Rose Cottage. In the 1920s they changed the name to Loyn View when the occupant of Church Cottage renamed their house Rose Cottage. 1881 – George Croft, yeoman, labourer, farmer, Rose Cottage 1901 – George Croft, Sexton 1939 register – George Victor Croft, forester, was an air warden in WW2 George's son Colin Croft grew up here and when married lived in the flat over the Old School before moving back here after his father's time. Colin's mother had the old school bell and used it ring it to alert the Armer's at Lodge Farm, usually to get her ice cream from their freezer. Colin and Betty had no children so after them the property was sold to the Boot family who totally transformed and updated the house and garden. 2020 – Nigel Bottomley and Michelle Skinner bought the property
