I hold multiple board certifications, but my most important education came from you, the people of North Carolina. Legislative and Advocacy Priorities

Economic Opportunity and Workforce Development

As a workforce development leadership professional and small business owner, I know what it takes to create jobs with livable wages and meet a payroll. North Carolina needs to do more to support our local entrepreneurs. I will champion policies that cut red tape in construction contracts impacting fairness to minority business owners and contractors, expand access to capital for new and existing small business owners, and invest in our community to bring good-paying jobs and economic opportunity back to the 60th District.

My plans for all of this includes:

- Expand trade career pathways through partnerships with local technical colleges, HBCU's and employers.
- Advocate for tax incentives, inclusive construction contract opportunities and grants for small and minority-owned businesses.
- Support local entrepreneurship through a Community Business Empowerment Act encouraging job creation and homegrown innovation.
- Advocate for available lifestyle improvement resources to low income and marginalized families

Affordable Healthcare and Senior Support

In *North Carolina District 60*, I will fight to lower the cost of prescription drugs, protect coverage for pre-existing medical conditions for our seniors and aging population, and make

sure every family in our district has access to the quality, affordable healthcare they deserve. I plan to achieve this by:

- Promote lower prescription drug costs and increased funding for elder and disability care programs.
- Support legislation to improve access and supportive funding to home-based health services for aging adults.
- Introduce community-based Health and Wellness Resource Hubs connecting residents to preventive care and education.
- Advocate for more programs to cover the costs for (alternative resources) pharmacy to door step programs for individuals that are homebound or non mobile, keeping medication access available

Education and Youth Empowerment

- Advocate for increased public education teacher pay and classroom resource funding across Guilford County.
- Advocate for local resources for Early Childhood education instructors and teachers. Making available for a Early Childcare Education resource hub in every city further impacting the leadership development and training needs of the early education workforce.
- Introduce Youth Advancement Grants to expand mentorship, trade, and afterschool programs, and post high school programs for minority or disadvantaged youth.
- Ensure equitable access to early childhood education and technical support with advanced technology resources.
- Guilford County has over 80 Title I schools and it is our duty to enforce sustainable education access for all. Every child in our district deserves a world-class education that prepares them for the future. From early education in headstart through high school and beyond we want the best in education for our youth, as well as ensure our educators receive high yielding salaries and support.

Civil Rights, Equity, and Justice

For as long as I can remember the ultimate goal has always been, safe communities and a fair justice system. We need smart reforms that increase accountability and build trust between law enforcement and the communities they serve in all district 60 counties and cities. I will be a voice for every family, fighting to protect our civil rights, secure our voting rights, and ensure justice is applied equally to all. Some of my key advocacy points are:

- Strengthen anti-discrimination laws and equitable hiring practices for North Carolina citizens inner city and rural areas.

- Support reform measures to ensure transparency and accountability within public institutions including daycare and early education centers. Reduce the stigma of no children left behind from an early childcare standpoint
- Protect voting access and community participation through civic engagement initiatives fostering proactive education, awareness and accountability.
- Voter Rights Awareness and Education is a key tool to motivating the public to get out and vote during each and every election. The More people are informed, the increase in voter participation will follow.

Affordable Living and Community Infrastructure

- Prioritize affordable housing development and homeownership programs including buyer education, down payment assistance and homeowner livability programs to help avoid foreclosure. “You've bought a house, what now”.
- Expand public transportation options including rideshare and expanded transit routes to connect residents to jobs, training programs and healthcare.
- Support environmental and infrastructure projects promoting clean water, energy efficiency, and neighborhood revitalization during this century and for the future growth.
- Support for non profit and other grassroots organization in the areas of sustainability, empowerment through education and access to programs of improvement.
