Use only thos abbreviations that are firmly established in the field. e.g. Gamification, PBL, etc. Provide at least three keywords.

INTRODUCTION □ **12pt**, **bold**, **UPPERCASE**

In this section, Authors should state the objectives of the work at the end of introduction section. Before the objective, Authors should provide an adequate background, and very short literature survey in order to record the existing solutions/method, to show which is the best of previous researches, to show the main limitation of the previous researches, to show what do you hope to achieve (to solve the limitation), and to show the scientific merit or novelties of the paper. Avoid a detailed literature survey or a summary of the results.

The introduction presents the purpose of the studies reported and their relations to earlier work in the field. It should be an extensive review of the literature. Use only those references required to provide the most salient background to allow the readers to understand and evaluate the purpose and resuls of the present study without referring to previous publications

on the topic. The manuscript should be typed using word processors (Microsoft Word). The font used throughout the paper is Times New Roman. The paper size is A4 (i.e., 210 x 297 mm), minimum 8 pages and maximum 15 pages, one column format with a 2.5 cm margin at the top, a 2.5 cm margin att the bottom, 2.5 cm margin on the right, and 2.5 cm margin on the left. Lines are one spaced, justified. Page numbers should be included in the test located in header section of each page.

Manuscript submitted to this journal should follow the heading below, except for the review article: *Title; Authors Name; Authors Affiliation; Abstract; Keywords; Introduction; Methods; Results and Discussion; Conclusions; Acknowledgments;* and *References*.

Paper Title

This is your opportunity to attract the reader's attention. Remember that readers are the potential authors who will cite your article. Identify the main issue of the paper. Begin with the subject of the paper. The title should be accurate, unambiguous, specific, and complete. Do not contain infrequently-used abbreviations.

The title of the paper should be in 16 pt bold Times New Roman and be centered. The title should have 6 pt space below and 0 pt space above.

Author Names and Affiliations

Write Author(s) name without title and professional positions such as Prof, Dr, Production Manager, etc. Do not abbreviate your last/family name. Always give your First and Last names. Write a clear affiliation of all Authors. Affiliation includes: name of university/institution, address, and country.

Author names should be in 10 pt bold Times New Roman with 3 pt below. Author addresses are superscripted by numerals and centered over both columns of manuscripts. Author affiliations should be in 10 pt Times New Roman. The table of Abstract and Article Information should commence 10 pt space below the last address.

General Organization of The Paper □ 12 pt, Times New Roman, Bold, Italic

The paper will be published in (JIML) Journal of Innovative Mathematics Learning after peer-reviewed process and decided as accepted by Editor. The final paper layout will be reproduced by Editorial Office of JIML. The final paper layout in PDF type, and will be published soon with the other papers.

Manuscript content should in general be organized in the following order. *Title; Author(s) Name; Author(s) Affiliation; Abstract; Keywords; Introduction; Methods; Results and Discussion; Conclusions; Acknowledgment; and References.* Manuscript document submitted to this journal (in one MS Word min 8 pages and maximum 15 pages) should be arranged as follow:

- 1. Body text of the manuscript article (from Title to References, without tables and figures);
- 2. Figures Captions and Table Captions.

Section Heading

Three levels of heading are allowed as follows:

- 1. Level 1 (Heading1 format) 12 pt, Times New Roman, Bold, UPPERCASE, left-justified, spacing before is 6 pt, and spacing after is 6 pt;
- 2. Level 2 (Heading2 format) 12 pt, Times New Roman, Bold, Italic, left-justified, spacing before is 6 pt, and spacing after is 6 pt;

3. Level 3 (Heading3 format) – 12 pt, Times New Roman, Bold, Italic, left-justified, spacing before is 6 pt, and spacing after is 6 pt.

Body Text

The body of the text is a set of body text paragraphs defined as follows:

- 1. 12 pt Times New Roman;
- 2. One space, defined as 12 pt;
- 3. Space after the heading is 6 pt;
- 4. Spacing before the new heading is 6 pt;
- 5. No indentation for the first line.

Enumerated List

List is sequentially numbers as follows:

- 1. Spacing before the start of the list is 6 pt;
- 2. Spacing after the end of the list is 6 pt.

Tables

Tables are sequentially numbered with the table title and number above the table. Tables should be centered in the column or on the page. Tables should be followed by a line space (12 pt). Elements of a table should be single-spaced, however, double spacing can be used to show groupings of data or to separate parts within the table. Table headings should be in 12 pt, just the first letter capitalized, and bold the "Table 1" word. Tables are referred in the text by the table number e.g. Table 1. *Do not show vertical line in the table*. There is only horizontal line should be shown within the table. For instance, see table 1.




Figure 1. Piaget's theory

Figures are sequentially numbered commencing at 1 with the figure title and number below the figure as shown in Figure 1. Detailed recommendations for figures are as follows:

- 1. Ensure that figures are clear and legible with typed letterings;
- 2. Black & white or colored figures are allowed;
- 3. If a figure spans two columns, use tables with no outline.

Figre 1 shows an included piaget's theory illustration.

METHOD □ 12 pt, Times New Roman, bold, UPPERCASE

Methods should make readers be able to reproduce the experiment. Provide sufficient detail to allow the work to be reproduced. Methods already published should be indivated by a reference: only relevant modifications shouls be described. Do not repeat the details of established methods. Experiment research, design research, sample, and flowchart must be clear.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION □ 12 pt, Times New Roman, bold, UPPERCASE

Results

The results should be clear and concise. The results should summarize (scientific) findings rather than providing data in great detail. Please highlight differences between your results or findings and the previous publications by other researchers.

Discussions

The discussion should explore the significance of the results of the work, not repeat them. A combined Results and Discussion section is often appropriate. Avoid extensive citations and discussion of published literature.

In the discussion, it is the most important section of your article. Here you get the chance to sell your data. Make the discussion corresponding to the results, but do not reiterate the results. Often should begin with a bried summary of the main scientific findings (not experimental results). The following components should be covered in discussion: How do your results relate to the original question or objectives outlined in the Introduction section (what)? Do you provide interpretation scientifically for each of your results or findings presented (why)? Are your results consistent with what other investigators have reported (what else)? Or are there any differences?

CONCLUSION 12 pt, Times New Roman, bold, UPPERCASE

Conclusions should answer the objectives of the research. Tells how your work advances the fielf from the present state of knowledge. Without clear conclusions, reviewers and readers will find it difficult to judge the work, and whether or not it merits publication in the journal. Do not repeat the Abstract, or just list experimental results. Provide a clear scientific justification for your work, and indicate possible applications and extensions. You should also suggest future experiments and/or point out those that are underway. You should use numbering but not used bullet.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS □ 12 pt, Times New Roman, bold, UPPERCASE

Recognize those who helped in the research, especially funding supporter of your research. Include individuals who have assisted you in your study: Advisors, Financial supporter, or may other supporters i.e. Proofreaders, Typists, and Suppliers who may have given materials.

REFERENCES □ 12 pt, Times New Roman, bold, UPPERCASE

All of the cited papers must be included in references. References should contain from journals and book the least 10 years from now. Minimal references are 15 sources reference. You should using reference management applications such as Mendeley, Zotero, or EndNote,

Sources reference is written following APA. The author(s) must check the accuracy of all cite listed references as the (JIML) JOURNAL OF INNOVATIVE MATHEMATICS LEARNING will not be responsible for incorrect in-text reference citations.

- 1. Unpublished data
- 2. Personal communication manuscripts in preparation or submitted pamphlets
- 3. Abstracts
- 4. Patents
- 5. Newsletters
- 6. Material that has not been subjected to peer review.

References to such sources should be made parenthetically in the text (e.g., J.J. Favier et al. (1986). Abstr. Prooceedings of the Eight International Cenference on Crystal Growth, York, UK, p. 50).

GUIDELINE FOR ONLINE SUBMISSION

The author should first register as Author and/or is offered as a Reviewer through the following address: https://journal.ikipsiliwangi.ac.id/index.php/jiml/user/register. The author should fulfill the form as detail as possible where the star marked form must be entered. After all form textbox was filled, the Author clicks on the "Register" button to proceed with the registration. Therefore, the Author is brought to an online author submission interface where Author should click on "New Submission". In order to do a New Submission section, click on "Click Here": to go to step one of the five-step submission process".

The following are five steps in the online submission process:

- **Step 1** Starting the Submission: Select the appropriate section of the journal, i.e. Original Research Articles, Review Article, or Short Communication. Thus, the author must check-mark on the submission checklists.
