# RHYTHM, SINGING, KEYBOARDS Class Syllabus and Course Outline Michelle Walker

#### **Course Overview:**

This course will provide students an overview of the opportunity to learn the basics of music theory, proper singing technique, playing the piano and other important skills of musicianship. This class is heavily based on participation in daily assignments. Grades will be based on written work, daily practice and performance assessments.

#### **Materials:**

- Pencil
- Notebook with paper (preferably three prongs w/pockets)
- Headphones (for use with Chrome books)

#### RHYTHM UNIT

#### Skills:

- Understanding of beat
- Reading whole, half, quarter eighth notes & rests
- Identify staff, measures, bar lines, bass clef, and treble clef
- Meter: 4/4 and 3/4

#### Activities:

- Drumming activities
- Rhythm games
- Rhythm Assessments

#### MELODY/HARMONY UNIT

#### Skills:

- Solfege scale & hand signs
- Basic sight reading with stepwise movement, Do-So
- Proper vocal technique (posture/breathing/warmups)
- Naming treble and bass clef notes on the music staff

#### Activities:

- Sight singing
- Warmup activities (posture-breathing-vocal warmups)
- Singing a variety of songs from various genres, cultures, etc.
- Orff instruments

#### KEYBOARDING SKILLS

#### Skills:

- Keyboard geography (high/low, steps/skips, etc.)
- Naming notes on the keyboard
- Playing a simple melody using 2 and 3 note groups
- Demonstrate various rhythms, dynamics and articulations
- Play a C5 finger scale.
- Introduction to intervals

#### Activities:

- Theory worksheets and online activities for naming the notes on the music staff and keyboard
- Group games to practice note & key identification
- Piano lab practice time & mini-performances
- Ear training activities

# Student Expectations and Rules

- Do not use your cell phone during rehearsal time. Students should keep phones in their backpacks.
- Encourage other students in positive ways!
- Speak when it is your turn and follow directions the first time they are given.
