

LIGHTING THE ADVENT CANDLES

On the First Sunday of Advent, we began with the candle of hope. Last Sunday, we lit a candle for peace. This Sunday, we light the candle of love. One verse that many memorize and remember on this day is John 3:16, **“For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.”**

When we look at the third candle, we remember God’s love. When we read the words of John 3:16, we know of God’s great love for each one of us and the whole world, too. We remember God’s love during Advent when we look ahead to God sending His Son in the birth of the baby Jesus to help us know that God is more than just a cosmic Creator. He is also a loving Father.

Light the candle.

Praise to you, O God, our salvation who is near. You hold us in our waiting and keep us awake to the world. You show up in our lives at unexpected times.

Bless us as we light this candle to keep vigil for your arrival. We trust that even though we do not know the day or the hour, you hurry to gather all people to your peace. Amen.

READING – Isaiah 35:1-10

A reading from Isaiah.
