

TRP Commission News - September 2016

The TRP National Commission would like to advise of some important actions occurring for the remainder of 2016 leading into 2017. With a change of Olympics Cycle, a new FIG Code of Points, and the flow-on effect this has for our rules and regulations, this news update will provide a general understanding of the future direction to be aware of in your preparations for the remainder of the year and 2017.

Please note that while the commission endeavours to keep the community informed of the anticipated direction leading into the new cycle, the information following can change and simply acts as a guide to what may occur.

The anticipated roll-out of Judge Education for the new cycle

1. Intercontinental Course - January 2017
2. International Course - March 2017
3. National Update 1 - At National Championships prior to event
4. National Update 2 - At National Clubs prior to event
5. State Judge Updates - States can update judges once the presenter/State Judging Coordinator has attended a National Update or completed the 2017 FIG Course
6. Full Courses for new judge accreditations - rollout in 2018.

The commission is reviewing the new Code of Points and will develop new Australian minimum requirements for competition and panel construction from National Championships downward. This will take into consideration:

- keeping panels as resource efficient as possible while maintaining the integrity of the results any judge panel modifications will produce.
- minimising the need for expensive technology at the lower end events if desired by organising committees in order to manage costs and the complexity that implementation of technology can create.

Australian Levels Program (ALP) 2017-2020

- Due for completion - End of Oct-16 to implement post National Championships 2017

Technical Regulations 2017

- Due for Completion - End of October 2016

Qualifying for National Championships 2017

- As per the current Technical Regulations 2016

Qualifying for National Championships 2018

- As per the new Qualifying Rules which will come into effect post National Championships 2017 and will be written into the Technical Regulations 2017 as such.

Competition Rules from now until Nationals Championships 2017

- as per the current Technical regulations 2016, Australian Levels Program, and current FIG Code of Points 2013-2016

Competition Rules for National Championships 2017

- National Championships will operate under the new FIG Code of Points 2017-2020 as applied via the GA TRP Technical Regulations 2017 and ALP 2017-2020.

Competition Rules inclusive of National Clubs 2017 onward

- National Clubs and onward will operate as per the Technical Regulations 2017, ALP 2017-2020, and FIG Code of Points 2017-2020

Competition Rules from National Championships 2017 to National Clubs 2017

- States to operate under current or new rules as they feel they are prepared. No qualification for the 2018 National Championships will be allowed during this period.

Technology & Judging Software

- New judging software and the capacity of our current system "Swescore" to adapt to the new Code of Points is currently being investigated leading into the new cycle.
- Ideally if there was a change of scoring system this could be utilised at National Championships
- New devices for measuring Time of Flight including Horizontal Displacement have been and are continuing to be developed and considered. It is anticipated that for future National Championships Qualifying events and below we will be able to cater for these by not requiring any devices if the event so chooses. Qualifying for National TRP events will still continue to be based on non-Time of Flight Requirements, and Horizontal Displacement (HD) could be judged manually if electronic systems are not available

High Performance Update

- A National Squad DMT CAMP is being hosted by the National Commission directly following National Clubs, with camps to be planned again for 2017.
- The commission are currently awaiting GA's High Performance review, which will affect the direction of High Performance within our sport for the upcoming cycle.
- In conjunction with GA HP, a planning meeting will be held in October to set a 4 year plan for International Events, National Events, and National Squad training camps.
