[Application and teacher recommendation required]

ART 1

This course introduces students to the basic elements and principles of art. Students will learn to create and discuss art. BAND

[Experience required]

In Band at McCaffrey you will learn about techniques for playing your instrument, practice strategies, and other music skills like music reading, expression, and tuning. We will play music of different styles, cultures, and time periods. You will also learn non-musical skills like working in groups, leadership, and creative thinking. Band students will participate in several concerts, community events, and field trips throughout the school year. The instruments in a school band are woodwinds, brass, and percussion (no string instruments). Most 7th graders who chose band will go into Band 1, however your elementary band teacher can recommend you for Band 2, which is mostly for 8th graders. CHOIR

[No experience required]

Choir is a class for anyone and everyone who likes to sing. It doesn't matter if you are an amazing singer or if you sound terrible, everyone is welcome and everyone in class will improve their singing skills. Unlike elementary school, McCaffrey choir is not a pull out program and it meets every day. What you will learn goes much deeper than what is covered in elementary school choir. INTRO TO AGRICULTURE 7th/8th Grade (This class should be heavy in 7th grade enrollment to feed to the advanced class)

This course is an Introduction to Agriculture class that explores all the opportunities this broad industry provides in California and our community of Galt. In this exploratory class, students will be introduced to opportunities in agriculture leadership, plant science, food science, fabrication and animal science. This course is designed to spark students' interest in the agricultural industry and help provide them with skills that could be used in later classes as well as in everyday life. This class includes experiential, project, and work-based learning through Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) and leadership and personal development through Future Farmers of America (FFA). California Agriculture Standards and Career Technical Education Standards are used to guide the course.

INTRO TO SPANISH or SPANISH EXPLORATORY

This class is for everyone, 7th and 8th graders who are interested in learning the basics of a new language and the culture tied into it. This class focuses on the Spanish language so that students can develop proficiency on a basic level. Language learning in this class will focus on understanding and learning to speak simple phrases, learning limited vocabulary and very basic grammatical structures. This class also introduces students to the Spanish-speaking cultures of Spain, Mexico, Central America, the Caribbean and South America.

LEADERSHIP

[Application and teacher recommendation required]

This course is designed for students interested in school leadership and school government. Students must maintain a 2.5 GPA with no "F's" or "N's" in citizenship in order to remain enrolled in Leadership. Students may plan and lead activities such as field trips, assemblies, dances, school rallies, spirit days, lunch-time activities, and student recognition programs. Students may implement a budget that meets school goals and carry out school wide fundraisers to support the many programs for students at the school.
