

My Identity: A video exercise

Aims	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Reflecting on one's identity• Strengthening communication skills
Level	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• A2.2 – B1.2
Time	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 1 lesson to present the task and plan the video• 1 lesson to film the video• 1 lesson for presentation and peer evaluation
Language use	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Speaking, Writing, Listening
Language Skills	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Vocabulary expansion• Fluency in speaking• practising conversational skills
Material	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Paper or computer for making notes• phones for creating videos
lesson stages	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The student makes a video of themselves which he tells about who and what they are like. In the video, they reflect on their own identity.• Helpful questions for thinking about identity: if someone asks you what country you are from, what do you answer? Does the answer change if you are in another country?

	<p>Reflect on what makes you you?</p> <p>Is this permanent or can it change?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Possible follow up questions: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Place of Living <p>Think about what your place of residence means to you?</p> <p>Think about different residential areas: what is your own local area like?</p> <p>What about the school environment?</p> <p>How much nature is in your area?.</p> <p>Is there something you would like to change in your local area?</p> 2. Spoken language <p>What languages are spoken in the area you live?</p> <p>What kind of spoken Finnish do you hear in your own living environment and how do different languages influence each other?</p> <p>What languages do you speak in different situations?</p>
<p>Harjoituksen kulku</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Technical instructions ● The length of the video can be up to three minutes. ● Plan and script ● Students first make a script for the video and then practise reading their script out loud. ● Further instructions:

	<p>Imagine that you are talking freely to your friend.</p> <p>Also think a suitable background for the video, for example, It be your favourite place.</p> <p>Plan the video shoot so that there isn't, for example, too much traffic noise in the background.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1.
