- Asynchronous activities I could assign to students that connect to specific topics (i.e. waste, water, energy, land based ecosystems, transportation, food, climate change, etc.) = 81-85% of fellows said this would be useful
- Virtual Field Trips (either synchronous or asynchronous) = 90.5% of fellows said this would be useful
- Synchronous/Live Stream Workshop or Guest Speaking with Students = 80-88% of fellows said this would be useful
- In-Person learning opportunities for students and families that are willing to do in-person enrichment programs = 27-37% of fellows said this would be useful

- Doing activities on waste before a live stream/virtual tour
- Video to explain activity before synchronous activity
- What do these survey results mean for your organization?
  - Preparing for SMELC helped get lessons ready for teachers and students
