LSIC Meeting Minutes September 12, 2024

Mr. Hupp called the meeting to order at 6:00PM and opened the discussion with the Election of officers: Alicia Waskey was nominated by Eric Hupp as Chairperson, Briana Chambers volunteered for Vice Chairperson and Carrie Hood volunteered for secretary. Mr. Hupp called for a vote, Debbie Scritchfield seconded and a motion to accept the nomination was made. The nominations were unanimously approved.

Mrs. Waskey moved to new business and the following items were discussed:

- School Safety- Mr. Hupp addressed school safety at Ravenswood Grade School which included:
 - Safety protocols in place for the students and staff at RGS
 - Utilization of SLACK as mass communication for staff during incidents.
 - Code Red Button and system which calls 911
 - Shield Program and Officers in school
 - Man Trap and entry procedures for signing in and out of students as well as visitors.
 - Various drills such as:
 - Code Red
 - Fire
 - Evacuation drills
- Focus Plan- Mr. Hupp discussed with LSIC Members the FOCUS Plan. Mr. Hupp discussed the plan being accessible by Parents and other stakeholders and where it was located on the RGS's website. Mr. Hupp further held a brief discussion of the goals and actions steps listed under each of the goals. Mr. Hupp explained that the Focus Plan was a document that could and

would continue to change and grow as the needs of the school, its students and staff changed based on best practices.

- <u>Accident Reports-</u> Mr. Hupp discussed a nursing report form Stephanie Dewees School nurse. MR. Hupp outlined procedures and reporting-tree associated with not only student but staff accident reports.
- <u>Student Progress-</u> Mr. Hupp discussed scores from BOY benchmark testing. Mr. Hupp discussed the 3rd Grade Student Success Act, HB3035, and the steps RGS is taking to ensure the progress of the students. Parents discussed concerns regarding 25 students per class and effectiveness of meeting those kids' needs. Mr. Hupp explained procedures for ensuring the educational needs of students both in bridging gaps as well as enrichment for high scoring students.

 - Better storage for Cooks and larger freezer
