

How is the Catholic Church Universal?

Learning Success: In this piece of learning create a Google Earth recording focusing on the cities and countries that Pope Benedict XVI or Pope Francis have visited.



How to use Google Earth: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=iuz6P2ftWBO>

Introduction:

- Select either Pope Francis or Pope Benedict's XVI's destinations. The country they visited is listed first followed by the city and time they visited this destination.
- Create a tour of the nations they visited (each nation has a strong Catholic following). Pin the city and outline (1) The purpose of their visit and (2) What they did while at this destination.

Criteria for "A Pope's Tour":

- Number of Places (7-10) Discuss with your teacher how many key places you will cover in the Pope's destinations.
 - Evaluate and select the suitability of images for each destination..
 - Describe the purpose of the Pope's Visit.
 - Explain what the Pope did while at this destination.
 - Record your tour.

End Goal

- A completed Google Earth Tour that is shared amongst the class via a Learning Management System.
- Students required to comment constructively on five other tours that they have viewed (Rose - Bud - Thorn Feedback).
- Completed progress chart that is filled in briefly at the end of each lesson.
- Student Review sent to the teacher.

Lesson Sequence Goals:

- Introduction and exemplar.
- Selection of location/ research/ evaluation of resources.
 - Present a student example that is going well.
 - Checklist of things that need to be completed.
 - Post all tours on a Learning Management System.
 - Students download and experience five other tours.

Google Earth - The Universal Church

Over the next week you are going to use your creativity and imagination to create a tour that Pope Benedict and Pope Francis have completed. You will be using Google Earth for this exercise and will be sharing your final presentations to your class.

1. Learn to use Google Earth.

- Your teacher will spend time with you teaching how to create a virtual tour. The possibilities are endless and you can create something as complex as you like. The following two clips will be very useful for you:

There are hundreds of videos on how to use Google Earth. Research and find videos that you can share with others as they create their tour.

2. Decide on the key Question about the Pope you will answer.

The next step is to choose which Pope you will complete a tour for.

Remember to (1) Find out the purpose of their tour and (2) What the Pope did while in this location.

3. Research and evaluate the locations that you will choose for your itinerary.

- Once you have decided on your Pope and tour, you will need to do research to find the places for your tour. You will need to include at least six stop overs for your tour. You will need to:
(1) Find out the purpose of their tour and (2) What the Pope did while in this location.
- Each description should be 50 words. Below is an example of a music tour I created:

The first stop on my tour of the world's greatest music events will take you to the beautiful English countryside in Somerset. You will be experiencing one of the iconic music festivals in the world. Glastonbury is a three day event where the best bands on the planet play through the night and day to a crowd of over 135,000 people. You will need to pack your tent and gumboots as you will be staying on site so that you can absorb the hippy energy that optimises this event since the 1970's. The proceeds from Glastonbury are donated to the worthy cause of Oxfam.



4. Present your Google Earth Itinerary

- Now is the time to start creating. You will have _____ lessons.

5. Share your Tour

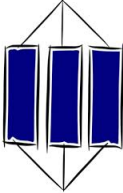
- You will need to share your Google Earth Tour as a kmz file amongst the class.

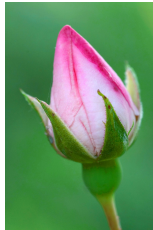
