Congressional Debate

This is individual debate in a large group setting. Legislative debaters research and write pieces of Congressional legislation that they feel will better the society in which we live. At a tournament, debaters will then speak on the legislation while using proper parliamentary procedure. Judges score each competitor based on argumentation ability, speaking technique, knowledge of parliamentary procedure, and overall participation. Jefferson students have qualified to the national tournament in congressional debate in 2012 and 2013.

DECA is "An association of Marketing Students" and prepares emerging leaders and entrepreneurs for careers in marketing, finance, hospitality and management. It links to Business & Marketing Education classes curriculum. In the competition portion of DECA there are many different options. Most of them are role plays, where the students get a business scenario/problem and then get 10-30 minutes (depending on event) to prepare their thoughts. They then get 5-15 minutes (depending on event) to present their ideas to a judge. Other events students have time to prepare ahead of time, these events include making a mock sales presentation, written research papers with presentation, promotional plans like advertising campaign.

The speech team provides students with the opportunity to develop their skills in communication and interpretation in the following areas: drama, poetry, prose, storytelling, duo interpretation, informative speech, creative expression, humorous,

extemporaneous reading, original oratory, extemporaneous speaking, great speeches, and discussion. Students choose an area of concentration from among the thirteen Minnesota High School League speech events and then rehearse with their coaches after school in preparation for the season. Select students will have the opportunity to participate on the traveling team, participating in tournaments in Chicago, Florida, and Texas. Jefferson students have frequently qualified to the national speech tournament.
