Students will be taking their Chromebooks home for the summer to continue their learning virtually!

Students leaving grades 6, 7, and 8 are expected to complete the following:

# Language Arts: LEXIA

- Using our adaptive practice program, the literacy work focuses on individualized skill building.
- We recommend that students work on Lexia for 50 minutes each week. The structure of the work time should be flexible. For example, students can work on Lexia for 10 minutes daily Monday- Friday, or two 25 minute sessions per week.
- We recommend students work in all three strands (word study, grammar, and comprehension).
  Students can rotate the strand they work in each week.

### Mathematics: ALEKS

- The focus for mathematics work is to complete the ALEKS course readiness module for the next mathematics course.
- Students can access their assigned materials by logging into the ALEKS program through Clever.
- The initial knowledge check and course readiness module are assigned in a separate Grade
  <6,7,8> Summer Math course in ALEKS.
- Students should complete the course readiness module and the knowledge checks or spend 50 minutes each week practicing (whichever comes first).

### Summer Reading: 2025 GMS Summer Reading List

- It is important for students to continue to read over the summer. This is a great activity while traveling or even hanging out at home.
- Select some books to read over the summer and commit to reading them!
- We've included a Suggested Summer Reading List to help you pick out great books to read in various genres. You are not required to select a book from this list; we included it as a reference.
