

Policies and procedures governing school dances shift in response to local and state health guidelines.

Dances and School Sponsored Off-Campus Festivities

When attending any Campbell Hall dance or school sponsored off campus festivities, students must adhere to the following standards:

- For dances or events on school days, student attendance at school is required the day of the event, and it is the school's expectation that students attend all of their classes on that day. Anyone not in attendance for at least two classes (excluding free periods) may not attend the event. Students may **not** modify their class schedule to meet this requirement.
- Vehicles on the venue premises must be driven safely and courteously and parked legally.
- Guests from other schools must be registered in advance when tickets are purchased. Non-Campbell Hall guests must bring their school IDs to the event, and the maximum age for these guests is 20 years old. Guests may not be middle school students.
- Students must follow in a respectful manner all directions given by chaperones, security guards, and any non-CH employees.
- If students and/or their guests leave the event for any reason, they will not be permitted to return.
- Campbell Hall, like every school in the country, has rules against student drinking and drug use on campus and in certain circumstances off campus. The events are school-sponsored; therefore, **use of any alcoholic beverages, cannabis, tobacco, other illegal drugs, or vaping at the dance is prohibited.** This restriction must be observed before and after the dance to help create an environment of decorous student behavior in which everyone can have a good time.

Please be aware that the school does not in any way encourage or condone student attendance at any non-Campbell-Hall-sponsored event associated with dances. As stated in *Drugs, Alcohol, and Before- and After-parties*, the school reserves the right to **dismiss or expel** from the school families that host **before- or after-parties where alcohol or drugs are either served or their use is tolerated or ignored.**
