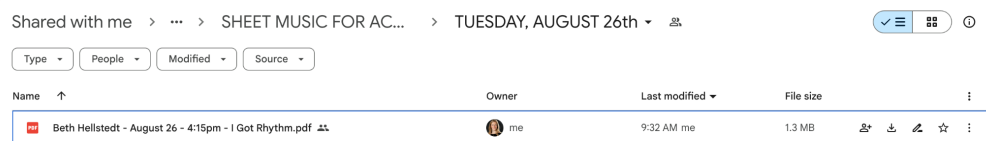


PUTNAM & MEAN GIRLS AUDITIONS: Sheet Music Instructions

→ **PLEASE BE CAREFUL NOT TO DELETE ANYONE ELSE'S FILES IN THE GOOGLE DRIVE!** It is a shared folder, so you all have “Editing” privileges.
DO NOT DELETE a file that doesn't belong to you. Thank you! ←

MUSIC MARKING & UPLOADING INSTRUCTIONS

1. Clearly mark your “cuts” on your sheet music.
 - a. It is unprofessional to give your accompanist any extra pages that are not needed. Clearly indicate where you will start and end the song, and cross out any measures in the middle that you are not performing.
2. Write your name and the date/time of your audition at the top of your music.
3. Create a PDF or take clear photos of your sheet music. *Ideally, it would also be a single document rather than 3 pages uploaded separately. There are scanning apps that allow you to do this easily!*
 - a. **VERY IMPORTANT → Make sure that the title of your document includes AT LEAST your FIRST & LAST NAME.** Otherwise, there is no guarantee your accompanist will ever locate your music! Here is an example of a well-labeled file:

4. Upload the file into the folder that corresponds to the date of your audition:
 - a. Monday, Aug 31st
 - b. Tuesday, Sept 1st
 - c. Tuesday, Sept 8th
5. If you would rather submit a paper copy, please drop off your sheet music at school and ask them to put it in Ms. Cellurale's mailbox. Music should still be labeled with your name, clearly marked, in the correct key, etc.

OTHER SHEET MUSIC TIPS:

- **MAKE SURE THAT YOUR MUSIC IS IN THE CORRECT KEY!** Just because you found some music online doesn't mean that it matches up with the version you've been singing along with on Spotify. It makes the directors question your preparation when you come into an audition and are surprised at the key the piano is playing the music in! Be a smart musician!
- **As talented as accompanists may be, everyone will feel more confident if they are not sight-reading at your audition. Please upload your music a few days BEFORE your audition date.**
