Distinguishing the two 17th century John Budds

	John Budd-267 who with wife Katherine (currently represented by Katherine Browne) was in Stepney, London, England. NOTE: There is no original source for Katherine's maiden name "Browne".	John Budd-1455 who married Katherine Butcher in Chichester, and baptized children there.
His birth / origins	No record has yet been found regarding the origins of the John Budd who baptized, with wife Katherin, a son John in Stepney in 1625. Source: • [would be good to list what sources were checked]	He might be the John Budd, son of Edward, baptized in Sidlesham, Essex, England, not far from Chichester; if so, his probably parents were Edward Bud and Bridgett Bird. NOTE: No maiden name provided for Katherine.	• Helen Ford: There is an entry in a deposition book concerning a dispute over tithes where a John Budd of St Andrews Chichester is mentioned. The date is 1634 which is about the same date that it is suggested 'our' John Budd moved to Felpham. Obviously without seeing the deposition one can only speculate about what the case was about and it could be another John Budd. Moving might mean that he no longer needed to pay tithes in Chichester. Conclusion:

What we know is that a John Budd and wife Katherin, baptized a son John Budd in 1625 in Stepney, London. **There appear to be no other sources for this couple or family. No other children. No proof that this was the emigrating family to New Haven, then Rye.**

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We also know that at St. Andrews parish, in Chichester, a John Budd married a Katherine Butcher in 1620, and what followed were a number of baptisms in that same parish that match the known children of John Budd and Katherine of New England/New York as named in 1669 records; namely: Mary, John, Joan and Judith.
