If you have not taken any of the prerequisite courses (equivalent or not) here is a way for you to take these courses at UNC:

You can take classroom courses for credit at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. All courses are credit-granting and will become part of your permanent record at UNC-Chapel Hill. You do not need to have previously taken college-level courses or have earned a college degree to enroll as a non-degree student; however, admission to UNC-Chapel Hill as a non-degree student is required.

These are the steps to enroll as a non-degree seeking student:

1. **Apply:** To enroll as a non-degree student, you must submit an application by the deadline. A nonrefundable application fee of \$80 is required with all applications except applications for readmission (after priority deadlines, a \$25 late fee will be added the \$80 application fee).
 - a. Types of Applicants:
 - i. New Applicants: You are considered to be a new applicant if you have never completed a class for credit at UNC-Chapel Hill. You are also considered to be a new applicant if you have previously completed a class for credit at UNC-Chapel Hill but have had a three-year or longer break in your enrollment.
 1. If you do have a bachelor's degree, you are considered to be a new post baccalaureate applicant (transcripts and GRE scores are not required).
 - ii. Readmission Applicant: You are considered to be a readmission applicant if you have completed a class or classes at UNC-Chapel Hill as a non-degree student during the past three years but not during the preceding fall or spring semester.
 1. If you are a post baccalaureate applicant applying for readmission, apply using the online application form with no application fee. If you are an undergraduate student, you must reapply through the Office of Undergraduate Admissions
