SECTION 22357.1 of the VEHICLE CODE is amended to read:

Notwithstanding Section 22357, a local authority may, by ordinance or resolution, set a prima facie speed limit of ~~25~~ 15 miles per hour on any street, other than a state highway, adjacent to any children’s playground in a public park but only during particular hours or days when children are expected to use the facilities. The ~~25~~ 15 mile per hour speed limit shall be effective when signs giving notice of the speed limit are posted.
