

0002 Stow, Selkirk

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South of the village beside the main road; on a haugh beside the Gala Water. In the 1960s it had the remains of a brick curling house. OS 6 in 1st.; does not show it. OS 6 in.; 1896; but does not call it curling pond. OS 1:2500 1894; calls it C P; as does 6 in.; 1908; and 1924.

The Scotsman - Wednesday 18 November 1885

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Stow.—The severe frost of the last three nights has placed a fine sheet of ice at the disposal of the lovers of the "roarin' pond" and yesterday curling was engaged in on the pond here for the first time this season. So intense has been the frost that Gala in some places completely frozen over, which has not been the case for the past four winters.
