6. Safety & Government Reports:

a. Fire (Ladder 17) - NO REPORT

b. Police - Ofc. Kevin Butler, Sgt. Hicks

- i. Reviewed rolling 28 day period from 12/10 01/06, 0 homicides and part one violent crime is down from last reporting period.
- ii. An influx of new officers will be coming to District 3 (an increase of 13 more officers from different assignments) 16 have graduated and are now in District 3, so please bear with them as they are trying to learn! A class of about 50 recruits will be starting in February.
- iii. Officer Butler provided a pamphlet on firearm responsibility as a toddler got a firearm from a family member recently in West Price Hill.
- iiii. Discussion regarding the need for more litter enforcement due to massive litter on Elberon Ave encouraged residents to put in records requests to review litter citations. Linda Ackerman has spoken with the Hamilton County Sheriff's about litter cleans up to help address the problem.
- v. Additional Questions for Sgt. Hicks and Ofc. Butler:
- -Question about parking in bus stops and no parking zones a citation was issued recently and no parking there. Sgt. Hicks explained that parking enforcement has increased in East Price Hill.
- -Question regarding vehicles going very fast on W. 8th St. downed past Curley. Sgt. Hicks provided an update regarding the traffic blitz in the fall.
- -750 Grand Ave. concerns regarding an unsolved murder within a few blocks from the Senior Chateau. Sgt. Hicks stated that we have one of the highest murder solved rates in the country. Very few homicides are unsolved with over 80% are solved.

- b. Angie (Community Resident on McPherson Ave.) requested for EPHIA's support in a residential traffic calming application through Vision Zero.
 - i. Angie's partner and son witnessed the mail person being hit and attended an event in Lower Price Hill after a child was hit.
 - ii. Angie was connected with Vision Zero (Cincinnati chapter) and is asking for EPHIA's support to apply for a consultation. This will help to gather information, could support a variety of ways to help address traffic calming and working with DOTE.
 - iii. Angie is specifically asking if we can apply for Vision Zero from Enright to Wells.
