- **Annual Title I Meeting**

Crossing Elementary will take the following actions to conduct an annual meeting, at a convenient time, and encourage and invite all parents of participating children to attend to inform them about the school's Title I program, the nature of the Title I program, parents' requirements, the school parent and family engagement policy, and the school-parent compact.

Crossing Elementary will hold its Annual Title I Meeting on **October 7, 2021 at 7:00 p.m. via Zoom**. A paper invitation will be sent home to each student receiving Title services. In addition, Title teachers will follow up with emails to the parents. Crossing Elementary will have an agenda that outlines their presentation and parents will be encouraged to sign into the chat portion of Zoom. The purpose of the meeting is to disseminate information about the Title program specifically offered at Crossing Elementary School.

- **Communications**

Crossing Elementary will take the following actions to provide parents of participating children the following:

- Timely information about the Title I programs;
- Flexible number of meetings, such as meetings in the morning or evening, and may provide with Title I funds, transportation, child care or home visits, as such services relate to parent and family engagement; and
- Information related to the school and parent programs, meetings and other activities, is sent to the parents of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand.

Crossing Elementary uses many means of communication to communicate with parents. Kayla states, "Written correspondence, special invitations sent from the Title teacher and phone calls are our best ways of connecting with parents. To aid in the communication with non-English speaking parents, interpreters are employed".

Kayla Pinnick, principal of Crossing Elementary states, "I encourage teachers to communicate directly with parents with specific information about the child's needs and the specific home-actions that can support growth. Teachers are encouraged to make positive phone calls home, provide positive handwritten notes, as well as communicate via phone and email throughout the year."

- **School-Parent Compact**

Crossing Elementary will take the following actions to jointly develop with parents of participating children a school-parent compact that outlines how parents, the entire school staff and students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement and how the school and parents will build and develop a partnership to help children achieve the state's high standards.

As soon as students are assessed at Crossing Elementary and a rank order student list of eligible students is created, the classroom teacher and the title teacher will place a call to the parents to explain how title services work. Parents will then be informed of the upcoming Title I informational meeting. At this meeting a school-parent compact will be distributed to parents and a short presentation will follow that outlines how parents, the entire school staff, and students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement. Parents will be asked to return the compact (with the required signatures) to their child's title reading teacher. Title teachers will follow up with parents who do not return them.

- **Reservation of Funds (applicable to districts with Title I allocations of \$500,000 or more)**
Crossing Elementary will take the following actions to involve the parents of children served in Title I, Part A schools in decisions about how the 1 percent of Title I, Part A funds reserved for parent and family engagement is spent.

Kayla Pinnick, principal of Crossing Elementary is aware that the Hilliard City School District is a district that is allocated \$500,000 or more in funding and must reserve 1 percent of their funding for parent and family engagement. At the second Parent & Family Engagement Committee meeting, "**Reservation of Funds**" is an agenda item. Kayla will explain "Reservation of Funds" and share a list of how Crossing Elementary currently uses this money for parent and family engagement activities and programs, as well as, gather input into how the funds might be used in other ways.

Crossing Elementary partners with members of the Kiwanis Club and a local church to help provide weekly food donations, supplies and volunteers for events as needed.

Building Capacity of Parents

- Crossing Elementary will build the parents' capacity for strong parent and family engagement to ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership among the school and the community to improve student academic achievement through the following:
 - Provide parents with a description and explanation of the curriculum in use at the school, the forms of academic assessments used to measure student progress and the achievement levels of the challenging state academic standards;
 - Provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's achievement, such as literacy training and using technology (including education about the harms of copyright piracy), as appropriate, to foster parent and family engagement; and
 - Provide assistance to parents of participating children, as appropriate, in understanding topics such as the following:

 - The state and local academic assessments, including alternate assessments;
 - How to monitor their children's progress; and

Teachers at Crossing Elementary communicate academic progress officially every twelve weeks at progress report time. Title teachers have a folder in which they send daily communication in written form to parents, which allows for parents to write back. This is a great way for teachers to keep parents informed about ongoing progress and is another way that teachers help parents understand how to work with their children at home.
