Lesson Objective(s) Learning Goals Students will be able to...	Students will be able to identify visual misinformation on the internet in various forms, mediums, and techniques

Time	Learning Task	Methods/Procedures
15mins	Anticipation Guide	Presentation Link: Misinformation On the Internet (Off Year Mater... Throughout the presentation, I'll be asking students to define or explain each section and where they are most commonly seen. Throughout the anticipation guide, students must take notes to define each section at the end, make sure to check for questions (For a more quiet class?)
30 mins	Group Activity?	Separate groups by tables and have students fill in types of misinformation they've found online and get students started on their own after a brief introduction to activity (For a classroom that would not sit through a lecture) Afterward, Have students present their findings and define the method of falsification, as well as present examples.
Shouldn't take more than 1 hour to go online and find all the examples	Worktime	During the worktime, I will be going around each table and asking them what they've found. For each section on the worksheet use this time to build rapport, or assist them with their findings. - Students are allowed to work with one another to fill in their charts. - If a student is found copying, identify whether they are absorbing the definitions and what makes each section unique Students may struggle with finding all sections, so encourage them to use other social media and news
