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Course Description:

The English Language Development (ELD) class supports high school students in developing English proficiency across listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Catering to learners at various levels, the course offers tailored instruction to meet individual needs. Students will enhance their vocabulary, grammar, and communication skills through engaging activities, collaborative projects, and interactive discussions. The curriculum includes diverse literary genres, non-fiction texts, and multimedia resources, fostering comprehension, critical thinking, and cultural awareness. Integrating technology and real-world applications, the class provides individualized feedback and support, ensuring students overcome challenges and celebrate progress. By the end of the course, students will confidently and competently express themselves in English, paving the way for academic success and future opportunities.

Course Learning Objectives:

Throughout the course of study, students will acquire linguistic and academic knowledge in the content areas of communication, ELA, math, science, and social studies with a focus on listening, reading, writing, and speaking. Students will also narrate, inform, explain, and argue in English, which will be integrated into the lessons.

Spiral review expectations include **daily communication** using two or more domains (listening, reading, speaking, and writing) with an integration of ELDs and SOLs.

Student Evaluation:

- Examples include tests, essays, research papers, project-based assignments, labs, district benchmarks, and other culminating assessments to measure mastery of standards that comprise a unit of study. **40 %**
- Quizzes, lab reports, assignments that build to gold, collaborative work and other graded assignments to assess certain standards in a unit of study. **35 %**
- Homework, spiral review activities, bell-ringers, and other graded assignments to assess certain standards in a unit of study. **25 %**
- Final Exams 10% of the overall grade (90% or higher for the semester in order to exempt the exam)
