(Do <u>not</u> draw a complete egg shape. Otherwise the instructions are the same.)

The it ran to the other side of the tree and nibbled on some grass (3). Suddenly there was a very loud noise which frightened it so much that it hid under a bush and curled into a ball (4). It's a good thing it did because that noise was thunder. Soon big drops of rain came down. Plop, plop, plop (5). When the storm ended, the little critter poked his head out and saw that mushrooms had popped up in the wet grass (6). He ate them all up and smiled a big smile for now his tummy was full (7). He returned to the bush (8) and curled up into a ball again (9). Soon he was fast asleep. (9)	Draw eye.
