Student announcements are now on a running document and are posted on the middle school web page so parents can access.




The Chess Club had its first meeting on September 22nd. The Chess Club meets every other Friday and all are welcome to join!










Ms. Schultz met with the grade 6 students to share information about the upcoming Unity Day celebration on October 18th. The classes discussed bullying, how each of us could support students and then created a grade level mosaic where each student listed something unique or special about them. The mosaic has been hung in the 6th grade hallway.



Mrs. Sunkes' Humanities Class read the book, "Sincerely Emerson," written by Emerson Weber. It is the story of a little girl that made a card for her mail carrier during the Covid-19 Pandemic. He was so happy to receive her card that he shared it with his postal carriers and it then went viral across social media. In her card she wrote a joke and a P.S. that said that she loved Taylor Swift. Taylor got word and sent her a special wax stamp to use on her future cards. 


The 6th Grade Scientists have been SO BUSY!!!!

- 1. Mystery Bag Observations We used our powers of observation (sight, smell, sound, touch) to identify various mystery objects. Students also practiced using descriptive scientific adjectives.
- 2. Coxsackie Riverside Park Field Trip We practiced our skills of estimation and metric measurement using the Hudson River fish etched into the park sidewalks.
- 3. Siuslaw Model Forest 6th Grade Scientists went on a nature scavenger hunt, learned about the power of water and flood plains, experimented with how to best filter muddy water, learned about plant anatomy and food webs and identified animals based on their skulls and pelts.
- 4. Bubble Lab So many challenges here. We continued to apply our measurement skills as we created the perfect bubble solution with a magical ratio of water, dish detergent and corn syrup. Scientists cooperated with one another and collaborated as they measured volume, blew bubbles and recorded data.



Becky Faller wrote a CAFE grant last year to add some color to our stairwells! The stair risers have math facts and positive affirmations on them to inspire students and help them be successful in math through exposure and review.
