#### **DISCIPLINARY INFRACTIONS AND RESPONSES**

### **Strategies and Procedures**

#### 1. Student Expectations

- a. Students in our school are given every opportunity to make positive and constructive behavioral choices and decisions. Further, they are also held accountable for their actions (commensurate with their age and other factors). For those students who have difficulty in choosing acceptable modes of behavior, the following measures have been identified as appropriate.
- b. Further, a student may be subject to discipline for conduct constituting a violation or crime which is committed on campus, off campus during school hours, off campus at a school sponsored activity, or off of school premises or at non-school-sponsored activities to the extent that the Administration of the school believes that the continued attendance of the student would constitute endangerment to the health, safety, welfare or morals of the student and/or others in the school.

### 2. Disciplinary Options

The disciplinary options or range of actions which may be imposed for violations of the behavior code include (but are not limited to) the following:

- a. Verbal warning or reprimand
- b. Parent/guardian conference or phone call (\*)
- c. Restorative Action Plan with Advocate (\*)
- d. In-school suspension (8:15 a.m.-3:45 p.m.) (\*)
- e. Community Service (15-50 hours) (\*)
- f. No longer allowed to go on fieldtrips (\*)
- g. Temporarily suspended from field trips (\*)
- h. Police involvement (\*)
- i. Everfi anti bullying course
- j. CAT/CAS meeting which may include a drug/alcohol assessment
- k. Drug test/breathalyzer
- I. Life coach session(s)

- m. Suspension from school (\*)
- n. Long-term suspension or expulsion (\*)
- o. Other (as determined by administration and/or advocate)

## **Administrative Discipline Chart – Community Prep HS**

The referrals (penalties, consequences) set forth in this Administrative Discipline Chart are only guidelines for the determination of each case by the Administration. As is the desire of the Board of Education, all relevant factors are to be taken into consideration in determining an appropriate consequence or penalty. Thus, the Administration, when supported by relevant facts and appropriate circumstances, reserves the right to impose a more severe penalty than that set forth in the referral column based upon the severity of the incident. Students facing long-term suspension (in excess of five (5) days) have a right to a Superintendent's Hearing. Students are subject to the rules and regulations cited in the discipline code while appearing at or attending any school-sponsored activity even when that activity is not taking place during normal school hours or on school premises (e.g., athletic contests, field trips, co-curricular activities, student events, etc.). This also includes while on school transportation.
