Reflection:	<p>This has consistently been a great project for students to start with. Most students were able to be successful in completing the project. There were a few students that were not engaged in the project because they simply didn't know what to do. Students glazing turned out much better this year than last and that was because I slowed really down to emphasize the importance of glaze thickness. I don't know if I want to make bobble heads instead next year... I may experiment with that. Students also seemed to forget what figurative art was by the end of the unit.</p>
Action Items:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Require students to have their sketch checked off before moving onto the forming of their pieces.</li> <li>- Spend more time with sketches and go table to table giving advice.</li> <li>- Remind students consistently through the lesson of what "figurative art" is.</li> <li>- Emphasize Score and slip more</li> </ul>
