Matt 10:2 (NIV) These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, **Simon** (who is called Peter) and his brother **Andrew**; **James** son of Zebedee, and his brother **John**;

- 3 Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus;
- 4 **Simon** the Zealot and **Judas** Iscariot, who betrayed him.

Mark 3:16 (NIV) These are the twelve he appointed: **Simon** (to whom he gave the name Peter);

- 17 James son of Zebedee and his brother John (to them he gave the name Boanerges, which means Sons of Thunder);
- 18 Andrew, Philip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Thomas, James son of Alphaeus, Thaddaeus, Simon the Zealot
- 19 and **Judas** Iscariot, who betrayed him.

Luke 6:14 (NIV) **Simon** (whom he named Peter), his brother **Andrew**, **James**, **John**, **Philip**, **Bartholomew**,

- 15 Matthew, Thomas, James son of Alphaeus, Simon who was called the Zealot,
- 16 Judas son of James, and Judas Iscariot, who became a traitor.

John 1:40 (NIV) Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, was one of the two who heard what John had said and who had followed Jesus.

- 41 The first thing Andrew did was to find his brother **Simon** and tell him, "We have found the Messiah" (that is, the Christ).
- 42 And he brought him to Jesus.

Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon son of John. You will be called Cephas" (which, when translated, is Peter).

- 43 The next day Jesus decided to leave for Galilee. Finding Philip, he said to him, "Follow me."
- 44 Philip, like Andrew and Peter, was from the town of Bethsaida.
- 45 Philip found **Nathanael** and told him, "We have found the one Moses wrote about in the Law, and about whom the prophets also wrote--Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph."
