- April: Sexual violence and women's health: How rape affected the women I study and my life with Professor Karestan Koenen.
 - Tuesday, April 18th, 2023 5:30-6:45pm
 - Kresge 502
 - Description: Sexual violence is common globally and its effects on mental and physical health are well established. Dr. Koenen will share how her experience of rape at age 22 altered the course of her life and shapes her research to this day. Discussion will include considerations of how lived experiences of trauma can both challenge and motivate an academic career as well as the complexity of disclosure in an academic research context. Attendance limited to 25 to facilitate discussion.
- o May: <u>Dr. Sara Rosenbaum</u> an expert in US health care and reproductive law will speak about potential June 2023 SCOTUS decisions (& their 2022 decisions) in relation to genders, sexualities, & health justice (May 3rd 1-1:50p)
 - Dr. Rosenbaum will provide this lecture virtually with option to attend in-person with food provided in a room in HSPH (G2)
- Possible additional event
 - Nancy Quintanilla working on organizing an event around trans-affirming/gender-affirming care providers in healthcare

 - Panel discussion dynamic artist and activist, <u>Michelle Browder</u>. She will be in Boston at the end of March for an <u>exhibit opening at the Hutchins Center</u>. She would be pleased to come to the Longwood campus at 12:30pm on March 30th during the day.
 - Objectives:
 - Increase exposure to the history of gynecology, specifically that of exploiting enslaved black women in the name of advances in medicine
 - Increase exposure to activism to tell the full story and center the victims in the narrative.
 - Link such activism with Harvard's commitment to reparations
 - Create links among disparate groups in LMA with overlapping goals (social justice, women's health, reparations, global health equity, etc)
 - Explore long-term relationship between Michelle Browder (her women's health clinic, other initiatives) and HMS, HSPH, affiliated hospitals
 - Event specifics:
 - Panel discussion moderated by a student
 - Introduction to the sordid and important history (historian)
 - Michelle to show through power point or her virtual reality tool the infamous <u>piece of art</u> that started her activism journey to reframe the narrative, her inversion of that painting and her own sculptures that honor Anarcha, Lucy,

- and Betsy <u>linked here</u> to explain the meaning and symbolism she has built in and how she uses art for medical justice
- Link this history, its recentering, to the condition today with black women being at much higher risk of poor birth outcomes than white women. (OB)
- Some interactive activity (also led by a student), e.g., exploring some of the artifacts available in the Countway collection and discussing their significance today; or a session to create art or writing related to health equity/reproductive justice which could then be curated for display in the medical area.
