The Small Diary of Charles N. Carroll

Copied by Evelyn E. Richardson

May 8 1854. This evening I, Charles, was ordained an Elder and chosen to preside over the Southanton Branch, New Brunswick. May God the Eternal Father assist me with His spirit to perform His will concerning me.

May 10th Today I have left my native land with the saints in all numbering 46 souls. We got on board the steamer John [W?]jarren about 12 o'clock and started for St. John on our way to the home of the saints. May God bless us and convey us by the power of his spirit [?????] to our appointed rest[?]. We arrived in Fredericton the same evening.

May 11th This morning we took on board Sister Ann Shelton with her father's family, they being 6 in number, making our company 52 souls in all. Left Frederieton[?] about 8 o'clock. Arrived in St. Johns toward evening. Went on board Steamer Admiral. Had prayer on board the boat this Evening.

May 12th Left St. Johns all in good health.

May 13th Staid [sic] in Boston over Sunday. Wrote a letter to Brother Phillips the following linen [lines?] came to my mind while on the board the board on the 13th which I sent in the letter to Brother Phillips:

Tell Sister Hannah that her prayer ascended up to God
She will obtain her heart's desire
And gain a blest abode
And gather with the saints of God
She will in Zion rest[?] her heart
With a mother's smile to cheer
With a father's presence blest.

May 15th Left Boston in the rail cars Arived [sic] in Albany where we staid [sic] over night.

May 16 Left Albany at 12 o'clock A.M. Went all night in the cars.

[May] 17 All day in the cars. Arived [sic] at Buffalo in the afternoon. Got on board the Steamer Ocean and continued our Journey acrost [sic] Lake Erie.

May 18th Arived at Detroit at 6 o'clock where we staid all night. We put up at the Eagle Hotell [sic] when we gave attendance the propriter [sic] being a very nice man.

19th arrived at Chicago in the evening. I pray the Eternal Father Continue his [??????] unto us and give us wisdom to persue our journey in Righteousness.
21st Staid [sic] over Sunday in Chicago this evening I was called upon to administer to Brother Geroge Jacques[?] and Elder[?] Shelton who had been quite sick all day which I did in the name of Jesus and prayed the Father to give them health and strength to enable them to continue their journey which prayer was granted for they recovered.

22nd left Chicago at 7 o'clock arived at Lowell[?] at 4 o'clock. Got on board the Steamer [???] Campbell[?] and at 10 p.m. we started down the Illinois River [????] all night.

26[?] All well but we are dreadfully crowded and surrounded by evil and wicked men[?]. May God protect us from evil and harm [hurt?]. We arived at St. Louis all safe for which I thank my Heavenly Father on our journey. We all got on board the Steamer Edinburg[?] to

start for the camp of Israel at fort Leven worth [sic]. Had an interview with Elder [?]. [?]. Eldrage[?] [... ???] O. Pratt at his office several of the saints is going up the Missouri with us [... ???] Elder Thomas Obrey[?] L [... ???] and his Brother [???] who is a [?] and [?] two teachers from St. Louis.

25th remained in the Boat and preparing our nessaries for our journey across the plains.

26 Got our things on board the Boat and started for the camp at 5 P.M.

27 This morning all the priesthood in the boat met in council and appointed certain of our number to watch over the spiritual and temporal Interest of the saints on board the boat and also appointed watches to watch our goods during the night. This evening I was called upon to administer to Elisa Shelton which was attended to by Brother Obrey[?] and myself. We also administered to Eve Shelton, Daughter of O.C.S. (This initials were not very legible, I hope I have them right) E.E.R.

23 This morning Elisa S is quite well again. We enjoyed ourselves

29 All well this morning 3 o'clock Bro. Gray's oldest Boy taken very ill was administered to and healed by the power of God.

30th Sister Adams was Delivered of a Daughter about 2 hours before we landed about 4 miles above fourt Loven worth [sic] found some saints on the shore waiting to remove to the Camp at Salt Creek

31st Remained where we landed. Sister Adams is quite smart and strong in faith.

June 1st Removed to camp found many of the saints paying little regard to the word of wisdom and the Destroyer has been in the camp and laid some of the number low in the Dust

2nd Brother Shelton's child very sick

3rd Sister Shelton very sick May god the Eternal Father send the healing influence of the Holy Spirit to unto her.

4th Sunday prepared for meeting was prevented on account of rain Martha Louisa Clise and Emily Shelton, Ann Carroll and a young man I did not know his name was baptised [sic] by Elder A.D.L. Buckland They were confirmed in the evening and many Blessings pronounced upon them Brother Thomas Obrey was married to Sister Louisa Shelton immediately after the confirmation 11 o'clock Brother Shelton's boy died.

5th Sister Shelton continues very sick has been administered to Brother Shelton's child buried may it come forth by the power of the spirit at the morning of the first resurrection

6th Sister Shelton is mending[?]

7th Daniel Jacques sick May God give him faith that he may recover from his illness.

8th Brother O. Pratt and H.L. Eldrege with some of the saints and freight landed.

9th Brother Shelton's youngest child died this morning and was buried Sister Shelton died

10th Sister Shelton Buried Brother William Carroll's youngest child died and was buried

11th Sister Jane McInelly died and was buried

12th Lucy taken very ill Fredrick very sick little Emma sick with measles

13, 14, 15 My family continues very sick

16th Lucy died this evening

17th Fredrick died this morning Emma died about noon and was all buried in one grave. May the great God give me power to bear up under my affliction and prove faithfull [sic] to his Church and Kingdom

18th Organized in companies to prepare for starting on the plains. O. Pratt chosen President H.S. Eldrege and Robert Coloing (Coleing, Colaing, Colcing) councilers. A.D.L. Buckland[?]

captain of fifter Elder Skeen (?) [sic] Chaplain
19th Went to Wston to purcahse nessaries [sic] for my journey rained very heavy in the evening
20th and 21st remained at Salt Creek some of the wagons started out
22nd Went on about 15 miles May God pro soar se [preserve?] me and my remaining children on our journey
23 Several persons died in camp today
24 Removed 7 miles farther on
25 Sunday had meeting at 4 o'clock this afternoon Sacrament administered by Elder Wells
26 Waiting for the remainder of the company to come up

Carroll Family Traditions

Copied from the record of Amy Carroll Stark

James O'Carroll of Ireland and Newfoundland

Armagh, Armagh Co., Ireland is given as the birthplace of our ancestor, James O'Carroll, in our records, but we do not know the date of his birth.

Tradition handed down by his son, Patrick, says that he had property in Tyrone County. He was banished from Ireland and his property confiscated, but for what reasons we do not know.

He settled in Newfoundland and there married Margaret Pottle, daughter of Joseph Pottle. Tradition says that he was hired to wed the girl by an English nobleman who was the father of her child, Terrence, out of wedlock. This child was known as O'Carroll.

James O'Carroll acquired a large shipping interest in Newfoundland. His son by Margaret Pottle, Pottle, Patrick O'Carroll, was born there, April 25th 1789.

The Mother of Charles

I have heard my father tell, at different times, that after his mother's father's death (Thomas Negus), his grandmother, Sarah Hawkins Negus, was persuaded to return to her parents in England. They were titled and wealthy, and had opposed her union with Thomas Negus because he was of the people. Her father was Sir Henry Hawkins of London. She was to return to her parents only on condition that she would leave her children behind. Being poor and alone it is supposed she was persuaded to do this.

This is why my father's mother Ann Negus was brought up with the family of Lee[?]. My father said he has heard his mother tell that when she was taken to the home of Mr. Lee as a small child, she well remembered a large letter or package being handed to Mrs. Lee, with the request that is be given to her, Ann Negus, when she became older. Once she asked for it when she was almost grown, but Mrs. Lee told her it would do her no good. She never saw it, but thinks had she been permitted to have it she would have learned much more concerning her mother's family than she without the message was ever able to learn.

My father, Charles Negus Carroll, said there was at one time a probability of their receiving property from his mother's people, but they as heirs did not take the matter up.

While Father was living in Heber City he and his brothers, William and Patrick, received notice from the Bank of England that they were among the heirs listed in a will that was being executed at a certain date and urged that they send a representative.

The brothers talked it over. The others wanted Father to go but he was unable to do so at the time specified so Uncle Billy went. The story is that when he arrived in England other heirs plied him with liquor and kept him in a half drunken condition which rendered him unfit to do business. They continued to do this until his visa expired, then put him on a ship for the return trip to the United States. With mission unaccomplished the brothers

remained in ignorance of fortune which eluded them.

My father, Patrick Carroll, who was the James and Margaret Carroll, was born at St. Johns Newfoundland in British North America April 25th 1789.

His father was born in the County of Armagh[?] province of Ulster Ireland, and died at St. Johns Newfoundland.

His mother who was the Daughter of Joseph Pottle was born in ST. Johns Newfoundland and died in the province of New Brunswick British North America.

My mother, Nancy (or Ann) Carroll whose name previos to her marriage, was Negus Daughter of Thomas and Sarah Hawkins Negus, was born in the province of New Brunswick July 5th 1786.

Her mother Died in the year 1797.

Her father who was the son of Thomas and Jane Negus was born in Cambridge England Dear[?] 1753 and died 1792.

My mothers [sic] brother Carles Negus was born August the 28th 1789 and died Decr [sic]

25th 1813[?]

My mothers [sic] sister Sarah Negus was born Decy [sic] the 25th 1791

My father was married the 13th of Decy [sic] 1811 and his family are as follows.

May 9th Prepared to lead this Branch to the home of the saints.

May 10th Started on board the Steamer [W?]arren for St. John with a company of 57 Souls for our home in Zion. May God Bless us and convey us by the power of His Spirit safe to our appointed rest.

May 11th Left Fredericton at which place we took on board sister Ann Shelton and family arrived at St. John went on board the Steamer Admiral had prayer this Evening on board the boat.

May 12th Arrived at Boston God [Got?] our baggage in the car and tickets to Chicago

14th Sunday put on at the Buffalo House Boston. Wrote a letter to Elder Phillips.

Willard was Baptised [sic] Sept 1st 1855 in Provo Utah County by Bishop Duke.

[Orderville Biography]

Orderville January 30th 1880

I Charles Negus Carroll do here write by way of explanation concerning my fathers as far as I know.

My father Patrick Carroll or O Carroll who was the Son of James and Margarett O Carroll was born at St Johns Newfoundland in British North America April 25th 1789 and the family were known by the name of O Carroll until the children were grown and going to school then we gradually drop'd the O out of our name and are now known by the name of Carroll.

My mother Nancy Carroll who was the Daughter of Thomas and Sarah Negus was Born in the province of New Brunswick July 9th 1786. Her father died when she was quite young.

She was brought up in a family by the name of Lee, and they having a daughter Nancy, my mother was called by the name of Ann to distinguish them apart, and was known by that name until her death. It may be that her name and birth is recorded in the English Church Record in Redrickton the Capitol of Newbrunswick now in the Canadian Dominion.

A Revelation Given through President John Taylor

at Salt Lake City, Utah Territory, October 13th 1882

(Copied by Jacob Z. Richardson on October 30, 1959, from the diary of Charles Negus Carroll, written in his own handwriting. This revelation was found by itself in the back of the book. The book had been turned over with the writing from the back toward the front.)

Thus saith the Lord to the Twelve and to the priesthood and people of my Church: Let My servants George Tensdale [Teasdale?] and Heber J. Grant be appointed to fill the vacancies in the Twelve, that you may be fully organised [sic] and prepared for the labours devolving upon you, for you have a great work to perform; and then proceed to fill up the presiding quorum of Seventies, and [?????] in organizing that body of my priesthood, who are your co-labourers in the ministry. You may appoint Samour[?] B. Young to fill up the vacancy in the presiding quorum of Seventies, if he will conform to my law; for it is not meet that men who will not abide my law shall preside over my priesthood and then proceed forthwith and call to your aid any assistance that you may require from among the Seventies to assist you in your labours [sic] in introducing and maintaining the gospel among the Lamanites throughout the land. And then let High Priests be selected under the direction of the First Presidency to preside over the various organizations that shall exist among this people; that those who receive the gospel may be taught in the doctrines of my church and in the ordinances and laws thereof; and also in the things pertaining to my Zion and my kingdom, saith the Lord that they may be one with you in my church and my kingdom.

Let the presidency of my church be one in all things, and let the Twelve also be one in all things, and let them all be one with me as I am one with the Father.

And let the High Priests organize themselves and purify themselves, and prepare themselves for this labour [sic], and for all other labours [sic] that they may be called upon to fulfill.

And let the presidents of stakes also purify themselves, and the priesthood in their various stakes according to my law in all the various departments thereof, in the High Councils, in the Elders quorums, that every quorum may be fully organized according to the order of my church, and then let them inquire into the standing and fellowship of all that hold my holy priesthood in their several stakes, and if they find those that are unworthy let them remove them, except they repent; for my priesthood whom I have called and whom I have sustained and honored, shall honour [sic] me and obey my laws, and the laws of my holy priesthood or they shall not be considered worthy to hold my priesthood saith the Lord. And let my priesthood [sic] humble themselves before me and seek not their own will, but my will; for if my priesthood whom I have chosen, and called, and endowed with the spirit and gifts of their several callings, and with the power thereof, do not acknowledge me I will not acknowledge them, saith the Lord. For I will be honoured [sic] and obeyed by my Priesthood.

And then, I call upon my priesthood and upon all my people, to repent of their sins and shortcomings, of the covetousness and pride and self will, and of all their iniquities wherein they sin against me; and seek with all humility to fulfill my law; as my priesthood, my saints, and my people; and I call upon the hands of families to put their house in order according to the law of God, and attend to the various duties and responsibilities associated therewith, and to purify themselves before me, and to purge out iniquity from their households and I will bless and be with you saith the Lord, and ye shall gather together in your holy places wherein ye assemble to call upon me, and ye shall ask for such things as are right, and I will hear your prayers, and my spirit and power shall be with you and my blessings shall rest upon you, upon your families, your dwellings and your households, upon your flocks and herds and fields, your orchards and vineyards, and upon all that pertain to

you, and you shall be my people and I will be your God, and your enemies shall not have dominion over you. I will preserve you and confound them saith the Lord, and they shall not have power nor dominion over you for my word shall go forth and my work shall be established and my rule, and my power and my dominion shall prevail among my people, and all nations shall yet acknowledge me.

Even so Amen.
