New Rochelle's Lynne Layne won her first of consecutive Outstanding Female Athlete Awards by winning the 100m (12.01) and Long Jump (18' 1"). In fact, it was a meet of doubles, as Longwood's Alexa Manning won the Shot Put (40' 6.5") and the Discus (124' 7") and Sean Cuevo (Yorktown) won the 100/200 double (11.09/22.06). Justin Gaymon (Phillipsburg, NJ) doubled in the hurdles (highs - 14.55 /intermediates - 53.96) and Casey DiCesare (Irvington) won the Long Jump (21' 6") and the Pole Vault (14' 6"). In a unique double, sisters Avril and Lise Ogrodnick (John Abbott HS/ Quebec) finished first and second in the 3200 Meters (10:38.83 and 10:45.66). A meet record was set by Kate Cannon (Somers) 7:24.21 in the Walk. New to Loucks, and winning her first 400LH title, was future meet record holder and Olympic medalist Dalilah Muhammed (Cardozo) who won the event in 62.15.

Double winners included Rashad Johnson (Saunders) in the 100m (10.89) and the 200m (22.10), and Gary Jones (Webster Schroeder) who won the Long Jump (22' 8") and the Triple Jump (49' 10"). By winning the 4x100 and the 4x400, Colonie came within two points of winning the Men's title.

On another cold and rainy weekend, Troy Faulkner (Curtis HS) was named the Outstanding Male Athlete as he won the 200m (22.23) and the 400m (47.72). Carmel's Kristin Reese was named the Outstanding Female Athlete (second consecutive year) for her wins in the 800m (2:11.39) and the Mile (4:51.34). Nadonnia Rodriques (Boys & Girls) won three trophies, winning the 400m for the second consecutive year (54.09) and being a member of the victorious 4x100 and 4x400 squads. Other fine performances were made by future Olympic medalist Dalilah Muhammad (Benjamin Cardozo) who set a meet record in the 400LH (59.84), becoming the first woman to break the sixty second barrier in that race. Kyle Merber (Half Hollow Hills West) was the winner of the Mile (4:12.81), Vanessa Stewart (North Babylon) threw the Shot Put 44' 1.75" and Brian McGovern (Mount St Michael) vaulted 15' 7". Jasmine Brunson won the first trophy on behalf of the nation of Bermuda (Bermuda High) - winning the Long Jump (19' 0"), and Janelle Clayton (Suffern) won the High Jump for the second consecutive year (5' 6"). Many lovers of the Loucks Games believe the 2009 edition was among the top meets in history. Suffern's women powered the school to the Combined title, led by two athletes who shared the Outstanding Female Athlete Award. Jennifer Clayton set a meet record in Long Jump (20' 2.5"), while teammate Shelby Greany set a meet record in the 1600m (4:48.25). Great Neck South's Terrance Livingston was named the Outstanding Male Athlete by virtue of his two wins, the 800m (1:52.50) and the 400m (47.70). Jesse Drinks (Ossining) won the 100m (10.98) and the 200m (21.62). Tyler Stutzman (Western Albemarle) won the 1600m in 4:09.86. Nate Quinn (New Canaan) set a meet record in the Javelin (188' 8"), while Commack's Mike Levine set a new record in the Discus (185' 2"). Nanuet's Michael Carroll set a record in the Pentathlon (3181). Benjamin Cardozo won the two sprint relays (47.35/3:46.28). Bronxville's time in the 4x800 (9:09.44) was the third fastest in meet history. But the two main highlights happened at opposite ends of the meet. Liverpool, late on Saturday afternoon, set the meet record in the 4x800 (7:46.50 – average 1:56.6), while on Thursday, in one of the great relay races in meet history, concluding with two of the great anchor legs, Westerly (RI) and Western Albemarle (VA) put on a show in the DMR. Stutzman's excellent 4:07 anchor could not hold off Westerly. In fact, the splits on Westerly's DMR were O'Loughlin 3:07.1 – Phelps 50.9 – Digangi 1:59.5 and Andrew Springer 4:03.5, for a total of 10:01.13, while Western Albemarle totaled a #2 all-time Loucks 10:01.87!
