

Timeline of Events (Raceday):

Honorary Starter (starts the race by saying the command found in NASCAR races): Develon Honorary Safety Car Driver (drives the safety before the official start of the race): Asgore Waving the Checkered Flag: Undyne

Volunteer Marshals: A majority of humans and Monsters who reside in the city (among them is Kirin)

Pre-Race: Many drivers are interviewed, describing the upbeat environment they are in, the Ebott Marching Band conducts the national anthem. After engines have been fired, the lead commentator will give a cold open to the race before describing the excitement of being here. The starting grid is also revealed around here, as well as the information on the race.

Lap 1: The race begins! Joey Logano spins out of turn two while Kyle Busch and Lewis Hamilton fight for the lead for nearly the duration of the whole lap.

Lap 5: Logano sustains a mechanical failure with his engine expiring, bringing out the first caution period of the race.

Lap 7: Race restarts, Busch leads early without a battle from Hamilton.

- Lap 10: Dennis Hauger gets a LITTLE too greedy with the curbs while battling Shane van Gisbergen for position, spins out and smashes into the wall in the process, bringing out the second caution period.
- Lap 12: Race restarts.
- Lap 15: Busch wins stage 1, George Russell retires due to a gearbox failure.
- Lap 18: Stage 2 officially starts, Mick Schumacher begins charging through the field
- Lap 20: Four-car pileup, consisting of Carlos Sainz, William Byron, Brad Keselowski, and Arthur Leclerc. A. Leclerc retires a lap later due to the damage becoming too severe, Byron is effectively eliminated from the playoffs due to being below the cutline when the race started.
- Lap 24: Race restarts.
- Lap 27: Esteban Ocon retires due to a hydraulic issue.
- Lap 30: Busch wins Stage 2.
- Lap 33: Final stage begins, Schumacher takes the lead early from Busch
- Lap 40: Drivers pit for tires and fuel.
- Lap 51: A ten-car pile-up takes out a good chunk of the remaining field. Bubba Wallace and Ty Gibbs are seen fighting on the track before a couple marshals break it up, Wallace is then suspended for the next event due to his actions.
- Lap 52: The red flag is issued due to extended clean-up. A trackside reporter interviews Kirin, explaining how much fun he's having waving flags before saying hi to his friends, family, and Kestrel. The red flag is lifted around 20 minutes later.
- Lap 53: The race resumes. Lewis Hamilton begins a charge of his own through the field, while Busch challenges Schumacher
- Lap 56: Hamilton moves into third, Nico Hulkenberg fights for the final playoff spot
- Lap 57: Final lap. Busch and Schumacher are side-by-side, causing Hamilton to split them midway through the lap. Busch then passes Schumacher and takes the challenge to Hamilton until the final corner, where Busch holds on to win.

Post-race: The podium drivers and a few others are interviewed. A tally of the results and points into the next round are displayed. The Driver of the Day has been revealed while the podium drivers are in the cooldown room before podium celebrations commence. On the podium, the

national anthems of the United States and Japan are played, the trophies are presented before drivers begin celebrating by spraying champagne towards each other. The coverage ends with commentators describing the next race and signing-off, giving highlights of the race before the coverage concludes.
