Comcast Essentials- This would be your best option in terms of reliability of service and have a financial need.

If you live in a home that has service available for Comcast, you can take advantage of this option. You will need to use the website below and fill out an application. New customers will get the first two months free and then pay \$9.95 a month.

The speed is 25 megabits per second. You may be eligible for this offer if at least one resident in the household participates in the U.S. Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP); your address is in AT&T's 21-state service area, at which AT&T offers wireline home Internet service; and you do not have outstanding debt for AT&T fixed Internet service within the last six months or outstanding debt incurred under this program. If you are a California resident and at least one member of your household receives Supplemental Security Income (SSI), you may also qualify according to the same requirements that apply to SNAP participants.

Add a Hotspot to your Existing Cell Phone Service- This is only as good as your cell reception.

If you currently have cell phone service, you can contact your provider and see if you can add a HotSpot option to your plan. You can use your cell phone as the Hotspot or get a hotspot device from the provider.
