

Scott Meador Memorial Scholarship

Deadline to submit to counselor is May 1, 2024.

Scott Meador was a 1995 Checotah High School graduate who enjoyed Tech Ed, baseball, friends, and life in general. He graduated from Southeastern in Durant with a degree in Wildlife Biology and worked for Tulsa Health Department. He was an intelligent, funny, kind man who loved his family, umpiring high school football games, military reenacting, NASCAR, U-2, and collecting junk.

- Complete the **attached application** form in **complete sentences**. If the space provided is insufficient, you may attach papers. Make sure to include the question being answered and clearly note additional papers in the application.
- This scholarship will be for \$500 per semester for up to four semesters. **Preference will be given to technical or practical goals from this training.**
- Money for semesters 2, 3, and 4 will require the recipient to submit a transcript showing a minimum GPA of 2.75 and letter from the school that you are still enrolled. Due to privacy laws, we cannot obtain this information.
- Attach a **seven-semester transcript** from the school.
- Attach **two letters of recommendation** from people who are **NOT related** to you. The recommender should describe how he/she knows you and for how long. He or she should also speak to your personal strengths and practical applications of training.
- Consider this application page as your **cover sheet**. At the bottom of this page, clearly write **your name, address, cell phone number, and an email address** that is not the one assigned at school since this will be deleted shortly after you graduate. **We MUST have a way to remain in touch with you. Please give the name, address, and phone number of a person who will be able to contact you.** Family members are fine.

1. We know plans can change, but as of now, what are your plans after high school? Where do you plan to attend technical school, college, or university? Have you applied and been accepted by this school? Why have you chosen this school?
2. What life work are you planning?
3. What school organization or extra-curricular activity has meant the most to you? Why do you think this organization has made a positive impact in your life? What have you learned that you will carry into a career?

4. Describe a time when your hard work and persistence has paid off for you or others. This could be school, work, community, etc., related.

5. Do any other special circumstances exist that you would like to add? While this scholarship is not based entirely on need, this would be the place to describe any financial needs you may have to attend a post-secondary school.
