NOTE – In order to graduate, students are required to complete a minimum of 42 hours from Harding courses numbered 3000-4999.

NOTE – Both HIST 1033 and HIST 1043 transfers as elective HIST hours. However, it will substitute for either HIST 2100 or HIST 2110 when students complete the associates degree as part of this articulation agreement.

NOTE – ENGL 1023 transfers as elective ENG hours. However, it will substitute for ENG 2110 when students complete the associates degree as part of this articulation agreement.

NOTE – In order to graduate, students are required to complete a minimum of cumulative 120 hours.

NOTE – In order to graduate, students are required to complete a minimum of cumulative 60 hours from a four-year school.

NOTE – Students who have completed an Associates' Degree with the required coursework can enroll in the 2+2 program at Harding. Students who have not completed an Associates' Degree must complete all required coursework and a minimum of 60 hours of college credit to enroll.
