Broadly speaking, the introduction contains the background, problem formulation, activity objectives, and literature review. Authors are required to express quantitatively the portrait, profile, and condition of the target audience involved in research activities. It can also be described the condition and potential of the area in terms of physical, social, economic, and environmental relevant to the activities carried out.

This section is supported by a literature review which is used to support the research concept. Authors are required to present a literature review that is primary (references to journal articles and conference proceedings) and up-to-date (references published within the last 10 years). Literature review is not limited to theory, but also empirical evidence. Enrich this introductory part with efforts that have been made by other parties. This article is the result of research which is a downstream of research results, it can be the results of their own research or other researchers.

LITERATURE REVIEW

The literature review represents the theoretical core of the research article. It includes review of related literature in essay style. The purpose of a literature review is to "look again" at what previous researchers have done regarding to the topics of the article. Research Results

This section describes how activities are carried out to achieve goals. Articles can be strengthened by relevant documentation, or the main focus of the activity. 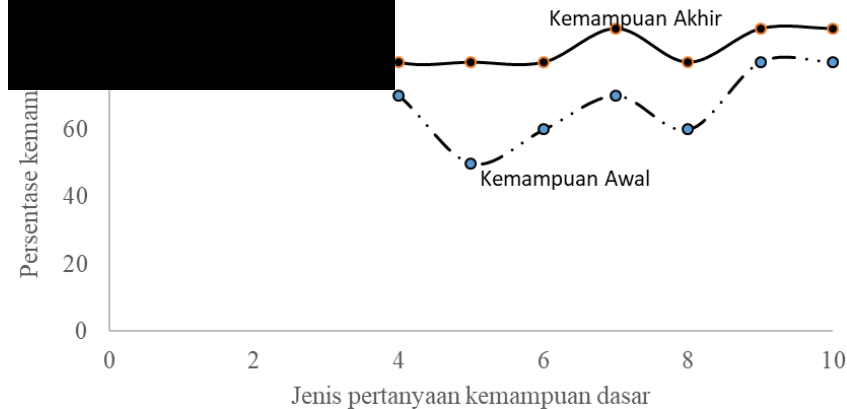


Figure 2. Basic ability test results (%)

Discussion

The discussion is the most important aspect of the entire research section and should be given the most space. The discussion contains the meaning of the research results that have been described. What is the meaning of the data analysis that has been produced in the results section? This discussion section is the most important part of the article, so the author is asked to provide a complete and clear discussion.

The discussion must show the novelty and significant findings of the research conducted. The discussion is carried out by (1) interpreting the research findings, (2) integrating the findings in the structure of science, (3) revealing new findings (new theory or modification of existing theory), and (4) explaining the implications of the findings theoretically and practically.

Use the latest research results from reputable journals to discuss research findings. The length of the presentation of research results and discussion is between 50-60% of the total length of the article. The discussion section is written in Century font 11 pt.
