Dr. Yu ZHOU, Professor, Earth Science and Geography, Vassar College
Innovation and China's high-tech industry, Urban sustainability in China, Overseas Chinese transnational networks.

Yu Zhou is professor of Geography at Vassar College. She had her bachelor's and master's degree from the College of Urban and Environmental Sciences at Peking University, and PhD in Geography at University of Minnesota in 1995. She has been teaching at Vassar College since 1995 and served as Chair of the Earth Science and Geography Department and the Director of Asian Studies. Her research examines Chinese development of high-tech industry and innovative clusters in information technology and biotech. She published a co-edited volume *China as Innovation Nation* (Oxford University Press 2016). Her monograph *The inside story of China's high-tech industry: making Silicon Valley in Beijing* (Rowman and LittleField 2008) is one of the earliest comprehensive study of institutional transformation and innovation in Beijing's Zhongguancun. She also published many articles in academic journals such as *Urban Studies*, *Journal of Economic Geography*, *Global Network*, *World Development*, *EuraAsia Geography and Economics*, *Geoforum*, *China Review*, *Environment and Planning A*, *Economic Geography*, *Journal of Technology Transfer*, *Regional Studies* etc, in addition to book chapters. She is the lead PI in grants from the National Sciences Foundation, Luce Foundation, Chiang Ching-Kuo Foundation, Asian Network and Lincoln Institute of Land Policy. She also contributes to *Chinafiles*, *National Interest*, *Huffington Post* among others. She has been interviewed by *New York Times*, and *Washington Post*, *Voice of America*, *Wires UK* among others.
