

LHS Internship Summary Paper and Presentation

For your end of internship presentation, you should **write a one to two page typed summary paper that addresses the questions listed below**. You will be scheduled to give a presentation as part of the Internship Exhibition Fair. You can be as creative as you would like for your presentation, but please make sure you address the questions directly. You can do a three dimensional display (tri-fold poster board), video, audio, or musical presentation.

Here are the questions that should be addressed in your paper and presentation:

Describe and analyze your internship:

- Why did you choose this internship and project?
- What steps did you take to complete your project?
- What difficulties/ challenges did you encounter during the course of your project? How did you solve them?
- What were the results of your internship/project?

Reflect upon your experiences:

- What were you hoping to get out of your internship? Did you experience meet these expectations? Explain.
- What will you take away from your internship? What did you learn (about yourself, the field you studied, life, etc.)?

Your personal learning or career goals:

- How did your internship/project relate to what you want to pursue in the future? (Or did it not?)
- How did your experience connect to career and personal goals?
- Did the internship reinforce your interests? Have you changed your mind? Explain.

Vision of a Graduate Connection:

Your paper and presentation should explain how your internship connects to each of the skills outlined in the Vision of a Graduate. Refer to your journal entries for this component of the project.
