

WHS 2025-26 PARKING PERMITS & REGULATIONS

Parking at WHS is a privilege. Students must follow all school, city, and state regulations. **Violations may result in fines, wheel locks, or loss of parking privileges.** To exercise this privilege, students must know and comply with the following parking/driving regulations:

- Permits will only be issued to licensed drivers only. A **valid driver's license** is required at the time of pickup, **including for ebikes**. Revocation of parking privileges may occur for the following:
 - Speeding and/or careless/reckless driving
 - Violating the school's tobacco or chemical use policy
 - Absences, excessive tardiness, excessive parking violations, or other offenses as determined by the administration
 - Other behavioral and/or driving violations
- **Vehicles without a visible permit will be ticketed or booted.** Display your permit daily. It must hang from the rearview mirror.
- Park only in designated student areas.
- Lock your vehicle. WHS is not responsible for lost/stolen items.
- Vehicles are subject to search if there is reasonable suspicion of illegal or prohibited items. Items found are considered in the student's possession.
- Illegal parking (fire lanes, handicap spots, or incorrect lots) will result in tickets or booting. Plymouth Police may issue citations.
- Driving violations (speeding, reckless driving) or school rule violations (tobacco, chemical use, behavioral issues, or attendance concerns) may lead to revoked parking privileges.
- Boot removal fine: \$10. The fine increases by \$10 per offense. Students may not drive to school until it's paid and they've met with the Dean.
- Lost permits cost \$10 to replace. Permits are non-transferable. Sharing, reselling, or using someone else's permit will result in consequences.
- North exit restrictions: Students may not use the north drive at dismissal until all buses have exited.

**Due to Minnesota state data privacy laws, the school is unable to share school security videos with families or insurance companies. Accidents should be reported to the individual's insurance carrier at the owner's discretion.*

**A boot may be used for parking violations. Students must meet with the Dean supervising student parking and also pay a \$10 fine to have a boot removed from their vehicle. An increase of \$10 will be added to the fine with each additional violation. Students will not be permitted to drive to school until their fine has been paid.*

**Riding snowmobiles to and from Wayzata High School is prohibited by Section 1325 of the City Ordinance.*
