Driver Education Policies

I. Attendance

A student must not miss more than 2 of the scheduled class periods. Issues of illness must be supported by a statement from a licensed physician or other health care provider.

II. Student Eligibility

All students, residing in USD 337, who will be 15 years old before the end of the calendar year and who have successfully completed their eighth-grade year in school are eligible to enroll. Driver education enrollment will be open to eligible district students, enrolled in school the previous school year, and other district residents or non-residents will be accepted on a space available basis if they meet the age and grade completion requirement.

III. Grading Procedure

No student will be eligible for credit in driver education unless (s)he successfully completes each Unit Test, the Handbook Test, and all Online Chapter Quizzes at an 80% proficiency level. One-quarter credit is earned for passing the course. This will be credited on a pass/fail basis.

A student who fails to successfully complete all instructional units, the handbook test, and the chapter quizzes at the stated criteria will fail the course. No incomplete grades will be given. A student must re-enroll in the next summer session and successfully complete all instructional units of the stated criteria in order to receive the credit.

IV. Cheating/Copying of Material

Students involved in cheating or copying of coursework material will be subject to disciplinary measures. This may include loss of academic credit and require retesting on all completed units. Additional academic requirements may also be required if deemed necessary.

V. Transportation To/From Summer Program

Parents are responsible for providing student transportation to and from the program. A student who is observed to violate any Kansas Driving Laws while on school property will be subject to disciplinary measures, which may include loss of academic credit.

VI. Make-Up Procedures

All course requirements must be completed prior to receiving course credit.

VIII. Test-Out Procedure



No student will be eligible for a test-out of the driver education program.

IX. Student Driving

No student will drive more than 60 minutes per day. All driving times will be assigned by the instructors. Students are required to complete 4-6 hours of behind the wheel driving with an instructor. If students do not meet the BTW driving requirements, they will be required to drive additional hours with an instructor until all standards are met.

X. Course Fee

A \$125.00 non-refundable course fee will be charged at the time of initial enrollment in the driver education class. This fee includes the cost of required student instructional materials, permit application fee, and Kansas Driving Handbook. Any district resident or non-resident, not enrolled in a district school the previous year, would be charged a \$175.00 non-refundable course fee if accepted on a space available basis.

XI. Schoology - Online

Students are required to read all assigned readings, along with completing all of the chapter quizzes as well with an 80% or better. Students will be able to retake the online quizzes up to four times, if needed. Assignments, due dates, and important updates will be posted on Schoology. If students do not pass the online chapter quizzes on the fourth attempt, they will fail the course. In addition, if students do not have the quizzes passed with an 80% or above by the assigned due date, they will fail the course.

XII. Unit Tests

Unit tests will be taken in person with instructors on the scheduled dates, unless there is a lockdown and we can't meet in person. If there is a lockdown and we can't meet in person, unit tests will be available online for students to take. Students must pass all Unit Tests with an 80% or above. Students will be able to retake all Unit Tests up to four times, if needed. If students do not pass the Unit Tests on the fourth attempt, they will fail the course.

XIII. Handbook Test

Students are allowed to take the Kansas Handbook test up to 4 times (if a student takes the test at the DMV, that counts as one of the tries). In order to receive a passing score, they must receive an 80% or above. If students do not receive an 80% or above, they will not be able to move on to the driving portion of the Driver's Ed course and they will fail.

XIV. Driver's Ed Textbook & Chapter Quizzes



Students will be expected to read assigned readings out of the Drive Right textbook, while also completing the assigned online quizzes for each chapter in the textbook.

INSTRUCTION PERMIT - AGES 14, 15 AND 16

- Present acceptable proof of identity
- Age: Minimum 14 years old
- Testing required: Vision. Written - or certificate of completion from driver education.
- Parental approval required: Yes for 14 and 15 year olds
- Driver education required: No
- Driving restrictions: Licensed adult in front seat at all times - minimum age 21
- Wireless restriction: No use of wireless communication devices except to report illegal activity or to summons medical or emergency help
- Passenger restriction: No
- Time required to be held: 1 year to advance to restricted license

INSTRUCTION PERMIT - AGE 17 AND UP

- Present acceptable proof of identity
- Age: Minimum 17 years old
- Testing required: Vision. Written - or certificate of completion from driver education.
- Parental approval required: No
- Driver education required: No
- Driving restrictions: Licensed adult in front seat at all times - minimum age 21
- Wireless restriction: No
- Passenger restriction: No
- Time required to be held: None



FARM PERMITS - AGE 14 AND 15

- Present acceptable [proof of identity](#)
- Age: Minimum 14 years old but less than 16.
- Testing required: Vision. Written and Drive - or certificate of completion from driver education.
- Parental approval required: Yes
- [Farm affidavit required](#): Yes
- Driver education required: No
- Instruction permit required: No
- 50 Hour affidavit required: No - must provide prior to 16 to move to lesser restrictions
- Driving restrictions: To or from farm job, employment or other farm related work; To or from school on days when school is in session, over the most direct and accessible route between the licensee's residence and school of enrollment for the purposes of school attendance; Anytime/anywhere with licensed adult - minimum age 21
- Wireless restriction: No use of wireless communication devices except to report illegal activity or to summons medical or emergency help
- Passenger restriction: May not transport any non-sibling minor passengers
- Time required to be held: At 16 will move to less restricted privileges if 50 hour affidavit has been turned in

LESS RESTRICTED FARM PERMIT PRIVILEGES - AGE 16

- Present acceptable [proof of identity](#)
- Age: Minimum 16 years old but less than 17
- Testing required: Vision. Written and Drive - or certificate of completion from driver education.
- Parental approval required: No
- Driver education required: No
- Instruction permit required: No
- 50 Hour affidavit required: Yes
- Driving restrictions: Anywhere from 5am to 9pm; anytime to or from farm job, employment or other farm related work; anytime going to or from authorized school activities; directly to or from any religious worship service held by a religious organization; anytime/anywhere with licensed adult - minimum age 21
- Wireless restriction: No use of wireless communication devices except to report illegal activity or to summons medical or emergency help
- Passenger restriction: No more than one non-sibling passenger under the age of 18
- Time required to be held: 6 months - after licensee has held the restricted Farm Permit for 6 months or until age 17, whichever occurs first, if they have complied with all laws the restrictions will no longer apply

RESTRICTED DRIVER'S LICENSE - AGE 15

- Present acceptable [proof of identity](#)
- Age: Minimum 15 years old but less than 16
- Testing required: Vision
- Parental approval required: Yes



- Driver education required: Yes
- Instruction permit required: Yes - must have held at least 1 year
- 50 hour affidavit required: No - at 15 must have at least 25 hours; must provide 50 prior to 16 to move to lesser restrictions
- Driving restrictions: To or from work; To or from school on days when school is in session, over the most direct and accessible route between the licensee's residence and school of enrollment for the purposes of school attendance; Anytime/anywhere with licensed adult - minimum age 21
- Wireless restriction: No use of wireless communication devices except to report illegal activity or to summons medical or emergency help
- Passenger restriction: May not transport any non-sibling minor passengers
- Time required to be held: At 16 will move to less restricted privileges if 50 hour affidavit has been turned in, and maintains a satisfactory driving record.

LESS RESTRICTED PRIVILEGES - AGE 16

- Present acceptable [proof of identity](#)
- Age: Minimum 16 years old but less than 17
- Testing required: Vision. Written and Drive - or certificate of completion from driver education.
- Parental approval required: No
- Driver education required: No
- Instruction permit required: Yes - must have held at least 1 year
- 50 hour affidavit required: Yes
- Driving restrictions: Anywhere from 5am to 9pm; anytime going to or from work; anytime going to or from authorized school activities; directly to or from any religious worship service held by a religious organization; anytime/anywhere with licensed adult - minimum age 21
- Wireless restriction: No use of wireless communication devices except to report illegal activity or to summons medical or emergency help
- Passenger restriction: No more than one non-sibling passenger under the age of 18
- Time required to be held: 6 months - after licensee has held the restricted DL for 6 months or until age 17, whichever occurs first, if they have complied with all laws the restrictions will no longer apply

NON-RESTRICTED DRIVER'S LICENSE

GETTING STARTED

Are you getting a Kansas driver's license, (DL) or identification card (ID) for the first time or moving to Kansas from another state? Replacing a lost or stolen DL or ID card? Or do you need to renew your current Kansas DL or ID card?

Follow this checklist to ensure your application process goes as smoothly as possible.

Document requirements vary, we have included what you need for different situations.

Build a personal list and collect original versions of the documents you will need to present to comply with Kansas' identification requirements. This will make your visit more efficient.

Before you visit the office:

1. Verify you have all the correct documents.
2. Make sure your documents are originals. Faxed, photo-copied, electronic or laminated copies of documents will not be accepted.
3. Remember, non-U.S. citizens must be processed through the System Alien Verification for Entitlement (SAVE).
4. If you have questions not answered in this document, check www.ksrevenue.org or call the Kansas Division of Vehicles' information line at 785-296-3963.

You can print our [portable checklist](#) to make sure you have all the required documents when you come to the driver's licensing office.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR A KANSAS DRIVER'S LICENSE OR NON-DRIVER ID CARD

When applying for any original Kansas Driver's License or Non-Driver identification card (Credentials), you must present documents of:

- One document from List A
- One document from List D
- If you are younger than 16, you need to have a parent or guardian present with photo identification
- Provide two proofs of Kansas residency from List C
- If Driver's Education has been completed, bring in the completion form.



- If your name is not the same on all your documents, provide a document from List F proving your legal name change

Non-U.S. Citizens must be processed through the System Alien Verification for Entitlement (SAVE) prior to application for Credentials. Documents are subject to DLFS review and approval. Additional information may be required. The DLFS will retain images or copies of any document presented. In some cases, document approval may not occur on the same day and may require an additional visit. List A – US Citizen

These documents show your date of birth, identity and lawful status as a U.S. citizen. If possible, select a document that has your current full legal name to avoid documenting any name change.

- Certified birth certificate filed with an office of vital statistics or equivalent agency from your birth state, a U.S. territory or the District of Columbia
- An unexpired U.S. Passport or passport card
- Certificate of Naturalization
- Certificate of Citizenship
- U.S. Consular Report of Birth Abroad

List B – Non-US Citizen

These documents show your date of birth, identity and lawful status or presence as a non-U.S. citizen. If possible, select a document that has your current full legal name to avoid documenting any name change.

- Valid Permanent Resident Card
- Valid Employment Authorization Card
- Valid I-94 (i.e. Asylee/Refugee)
- Unexpired foreign passport with valid U.S. entry marking and/or documentation

Note: Certain classifications must also be accompanied by additional documentation, for example:

- F-1's and M-1's must be accompanied by I-20
- J-1's and J-2's must be accompanied by a Certificate of Eligibility for Exchange Visitor, DS2019
- For non-U.S. citizen applicants, the Examiner will need documentation sufficient to initiate and complete a SAVE verification

List C – Kansas Residency

These documents establish your Kansas residency and residential address. You must present a document that shows your current name and Kansas residential address. A P.O. Box will not be accepted as proof of resident address.

If a minor child does not have a proof of address included in this list their parent, step-parent or legal guardian can complete a Certification of Address by providing two proofs of address along with identification.

- Kansas DL or ID renewal postcard
- Current Kansas vehicle registration or title
- Utility bill or equivalent no more than two months old
- Financial institution such as a bank statement, deed or mortgage
- Rent or lease agreement
- Kansas Voter Registration Card
- Current auto, life or homeowners insurance bill with applicant's name and address
- Current educational transcript/school grade card
- Current professional license by a U.S. agency
- Current W-2 or 1099
- Mail from a federal, state, county or city agency
- Department of Corrections Certificate of Identification

Note: A post office box address will not be accepted for address of principal residence.

Note: Proof of residential address may be established by a minor applicant's parent, step-parent, legal guardian or other person with whom the applicant resides along with a copy of the DE-56a, which must be completed by the parent, step-parent, legal guardian or other person with whom the applicant resides. DE-56a forms are available at all Kansas driver licensing offices.

List D – Social Security Number

You will need one document that contains your current name and Social Security number.

You may find your Social Security Number on the following documents

- Social Security card with your current full name
- Current W-2 or 1099
- Current pay stub with Social Security number
- A SSN is not necessary for temporary driver's license applicants with non-work status

Note: A SSN is not necessary for temporary driver's license applicants with non work status.



Note: * If you do not have a social security number, you must provide proof of lawful presence in the U.S. (See List B)

List E – Replacement ID or DL

If you need a replacement DL or ID card, you may use any of these documents as additional identification.

- Military ID, military dependent ID, military common access card or DD-214
- Medical health card or records
- Photo DL or ID card issued by Kansas or any state that has not been expired for more than a year
- Student or employee ID card with photo
- Immunization records
- Federal or state income tax return bearing your signature
- A copy of any federal or state income tax return bearing the signature of the applicant or his/her representative

List F – Name Change

If you have legally changed your name, these documents will help connect your former name to your current name. The documents must be certified original copies.

- Government issued marriage certificate
- Divorce Decree—Name Restored as
- Court Order of Adoption
- Court Order of Legal Name Change

Note: Due to Federal requirements, Military IDs and Military Common Access Cards shall be relied upon for replacement purposes only and will not be scanned or copied by the Examiner.

WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS TO OBTAIN AN UNRESTRICTED DRIVER'S LICENSE AT AGE 16 IN KANSAS?

Applicants under 17 years of age must hold their instructional permit for 1 year from the date it was issued or until their 17th birthday whichever occurs first. A licensee will need to provide an affidavit to the driver licensing office stating that they have completed at least 50 hours of practice driving, with at least 10 practice hours at night, supervised by a licensed adult 21 years of age or older and signed by their parent or guardian. When a 50 hour affidavit is not provided or completed, the license restrictions will continue until age 17. If a licensee has been convicted of two or more moving violations on separate occasions



before age 16, the license will remain restricted until age 17. Effective July 1st, 1999, a moving violation for transporting non-sibling passengers will be a moving violation.

A DRIVER WITH AN INSTRUCTION PERMIT, A FARM PERMIT OR RESTRICTED LICENSE MAY DRIVE AT ANY TIME WHEN ACCOMPANIED BY AN ADULT WHO IS THE HOLDER OF A VALID COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSE, CLASS A, B OR C DRIVER'S LICENSE AND WHO IS ACTUALLY OCCUPYING THE SEAT BESIDE THE DRIVER." MUST THE ACCOMPANYING ADULT BE 21 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER?

Yes, the adult accompanying the holder of an instruction permit, farm permit or restricted license must be 21 years of age or older.

WILL THE DRIVER LICENING OFFICE REQUIRE DOCUMENTATION SUCH AS A LOG SHOWING THE TOTAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF SUPERVISED DRIVING COMPLETED?

No, the office will not require a log, however we encourage parents or guardians to use a log to keep track of supervised driving time.

CAN A LICENSE OR INSTRUCTION PERMIT ISSUED BY ANOTHER STATE BE ACCEPTED IN LIEU OF A KANSAS INSTRUCTION PERMIT. IF IT HAS BEEN HELD FOR SIX MONTHS OR MORE?

No, the law states that the instruction permit be issued in Kansas (pursuant to K.S. 8-239).

IS IT NECESSARY TO RETURN TO A DRIVER LICENING OFFICE TO HAVE THE AGE RESTRICTION REMOVED FROM A FARM PERMIT OR A RESTRICTED LICENSE WHEN THE LICENSEE TURNS 16 OR WHEN THE 50 HOUR REQUIREMENT IS MET?

All Kansas driver's licenses issued to persons under 21 years of age and all farm permits are valid until the licensee's 21st birthday at the time of application. So, it is not necessary to return to a driver license office to have the restriction removed. The computer record of all licensees will be updated to remove the age restriction when all criteria to remove the restriction have been met. If the licensee wishes to have a new license issued without the restriction, he or she may return to a driver's license office and have a new license made. There is an \$8 photo fee.

WILL THE DIVISION OF VEHICLES REQUIRE AN AFFIDAVIT TO VERIFY THE FIRST 25 HOURS OF SUPERVISED DRIVING?

Yes.

WILL THE AFFIDAVIT REQUIRED BE RETAINED BY THE DRIVER LICENING OFFICE?

Yes.



WILL THE HOURS OF DRIVING COMPLETED BY A DRIVER'S EDUCATION STUDENT COUNT TOWARD THE 50 HOURS OF REQUIRED SUPERVISED DRIVING?

Actual time spent behind the wheel will be counted toward the requirement if the instructor is 21 years of age or older. Time spent observing or spent doing range driving, when not actually accompanied by an adult 21 years of age or older, will not be counted.

MAY A STUDENT WHO HAS COMPLETED A DRIVER'S EDUCATION COURSE CONTINUE TO USE THE BLUE DE-99 PERMIT UNTIL THEY HAVE COMPLETED THE ONE YEAR INSTRUCTION PERMIT REQUIREMENT?

No, the blue DE-99 instruction permit is only valid during the driver's education course. All applicants for a restricted license, must have held an instruction permit (or a farm permit) issued by the driver licensing office for at least one year.

WILL THE TIME THAT A RESTRICTED INSTRUCTION PERMIT (THE BLUE FORM) ISSUED WITH THE DE-99 COUNT TOWARD THE ONE YEAR INSTRUCTION PERMIT REQUIREMENT?

No, all applicants for a restricted driver's license, must have held an instruction permit for at least one year issued by the driver licensing office, (or a farm permit as discussed above).

WILL THE DRIVER LICENSING OFFICE ACCEPT A DE-99 DRIVER'S EDUCATION COMPLETION CERTIFICATE IN LIEU OF WRITTEN TESTING FOR AN INSTRUCTION PERMIT?

Yes, if the applicant has completed driver's education and can provide proof of name and date of birth as required, the driver licensing office will accept the completion certificate and issue an instruction permit.

IN THE ABOVE SCENARIO, WILL THE DRIVER'S LICENSE BUREAU KNOW THAT THE PERSON HAS COMPLETED DRIVER'S EDUCATION. SO WHEN THEY HAVE HELD THE INSTRUCTION PERMIT FOR ONE YEAR THEY MAY RETURN FOR A RESTRICTED LICENSE?

Yes, a notation will be made on the permit holder's computer record to show completion of driver's education.

CAN A STUDENT RE-ENROLL IN DRIVER'S EDUCATION MULTIPLE TIMES TO DOCUMENT THE NECESSARY HOURS OF DRIVING TIME?

This would be up to the driver's education instructor and the student's parent or guardian.

WILL AN APPLICANT FOR AN INSTRUCTION PERMIT, FARM PERMIT OR RESTRICTED LICENSE BE REQUIRED TO TAKE A VISION TEST EACH TIME HE VISITS THE DRIVER LICENSING OFFICE?

Any time a change is made to the license type held, the driver licensing office will require a vision test.
