


May 2022 Update

Member Announcements

Ukraine: As the crisis unfolds in Ukraine, the University of Arizona is offering unprecedented real-time online access to human rights practitioners who are actively working within Ukraine and neighboring countries. Connecting live via Zoom, these frontline activists, journalists, and ordinary citizens are documenting human rights abuses, assisting refugees and displaced persons, and framing cultural resistance to Russian aggression -- and in the process writing the proverbial "first draft of history." You can read the schedule of speakers. From May 16 to July 1, students from around the world can take this one-of-a-kind course, which draws upon the Human Rights Practice Program's global network of practitioners and scholars. The course can be taken in two different ways: on a non-credit basis (as a "Community Classroom" experience) or for 3 credits (as HRTS 495a/595a: Human Rights Crisis in Ukraine). Founded in 1985, Tohono Chul has been a celebrated destination for locals to global visitors and deemed "One of the World's Ten Best Botanical Gardens" by Travel + Leisure Magazine. We are seeking a visionary, organized and team-oriented Director of Strategic Growth (DSG) who will be responsible for the strategic planning, coordination, and implementation of Tohono Chul's fundraising/revenue generating programs and community-oriented activities. This person should bring enthusiasm about celebrating the mission of Tohono Chul, thrive in a fast-paced environment and work collaboratively with an energetic team of staff and volunteers. Tohono Chul will be embarking on a strategic planning and master plan process and the DSG will be a key member of the leadership team in that process and will subsequently lead efforts to execute and fund the multiyear initiatives that emerge.
