- ★ If you sing "O Little Town of Bethlehem," speak about the people living in Bethlehem today amid the US-funded military occupation of the land where Jesus walked.
- ★ Create a strategic procession with the Christ in the Rubble visual to key locations of decision-making or ritual importance. (Ex. large/influential churches, mayor's office, congress member's office, city council, state capitol, influential business leader, company involved in supporting the occupation/war, etc.)



CHRIST IN THE RUBBLE ADVENT CAMPAIGN



Christians 4 Ceasefire calls on churches to center the image of Christ in the Rubble in their Advent and Christmas liturgies.

This image of <u>Christ in the Rubble</u> is a scene from the Lutheran Christmas Church in Bethlehem in 2023, where the traditional manger scene features baby Jesus in a bombed-out home. While Americans celebrate Christmas with joy, people in the land where Jesus was born are enduring genocide and bombardment from American bombs. The families who have survived in Gaza, broader Palestine, and Lebanon are homeless, starving, lacking medical care, and, in the case of thousands of children, orphaned.

In Advent and Christmas sermons and homilies, speak about the genocide of our Palestinian brothers and sisters, both Christian and non-Christian
