- 1. This year's show involves ALL of ISB's Grade 5 students (142 cast members!).
- 2. The publicity, including posters, tickets, and the banner by the ISB fountain, are all student-designed!
- 3. Students contributed ideas for script, costume design, stage makeup, choreography, and instrumental music.
- 4. Most of the music you will hear is performed live by our Grade 5 students.
- 5. In conjunction with the performances, there will be a student art exhibition in the Chevron Theatre foyer, demonstrating a connection with the French post-impressionist painter, Henri Rousseau.
- 6. The students worked in art class to create pieces for "The Cat and The Rat" set.
- 7. We had an amazing team of 50 parent volunteers helping us every step of the way!
- 8. A group of students volunteered their after school time on Wednesdays to create and experiment with different theatre techniques.
- 9. Students studied traditional Caribbean dance, Calypso music, and adapted elements for the performance.
- 10. The show is a dramatization of the Caribbean Folk Tale "The Cat and The Rat".
