Layered Cheerful Daisies Card Instructions

- 161409 - Hope You Know Stamp Set
- 161289 - Fresh as a Daisy DSP
- 159229 - Thick Basic White CS
- 159276 - Basic White Cardstock
- 161717 - Pecan Pie Cardstock
- 146990 - Granny Apple Green CS
- 102584 - Garden Green Cardstock
- 147087 - Crushed Curry Stamp Pad
- 161665 - Pecan Pie Stamp Pad
- 158136 - Brushed Brass Butterflies
- 161634 - Pecan Pie Ribbon
- 154242 - Double Oval Punch

Cutting Instructions

- Thick Basic White CS: 8-½" x 5-½" scored at 4-¼" so that your fold is on the top of your card base.
- Basic White CS: 8-½" x 5-½"; 4-⅞" x 3-⅝" (for inside panel)
- Pecan Pie CS: 3" x 2"
- Granny Apple Green CS: small scrap
- Fresh as a Daisy DSP: 5-¼" x 4"; 6" x 2-⅜" (for envelope)
- Garden Green CS: small scrap
- Pecan Pie Ribbon: 6-½"

Assembly Instructions

1. Die cut the flowers, leaves, and (3) branches out of the Basic White CS.
2. Using Crushed Curry ink, stamp three small flower centers and one large

3. Using Pecan Pie ink, stamp the sentiment for the front of the card onto the Basic White CS and punch it out with the small oval. Punch out the Pecan Pie CS with the scalloped oval and glue them together.
4. Layer the flowers and leaves as shown in the video and put stampin' dimensionals on the back. Lay this on the DSP, but don't stick it down yet. Add a small amount of glue to the branches and place them where you want them, then attach the flower.
5. Lay the piece of ribbon across the lower part of your DSP and use tape to adhere it to the back. I also put one glue dot behind the left side of the ribbon so it would lay flat. Attach your sentiment to the lower right corner with whatever adhesive you like. I tucked it a little under the petals of the large flower and over the top of the ribbon.
6. Glue this panel to the front of your card and add your butterflies.
7. Die cut two solid leaves out of Garden Green CS and two open leaves out of Granny Apple Green Cs. Glue the open leaves to the top of the solid leaves. Die cut a stem out of Granny Apple Green CS.
8. Using Pecan Pie ink, stamp a greeting on the Basic White CS that measures 4-⅞" x 3-⅝".

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9. Glue this panel to the inside of the card.
10. Glue the flower stem to the left of the sentiment, add the flower to the top of the stem, and then glue the leaves to the stem. I tucked them under the stem a little, one to the left of the stem and one to the right of the stem.
11. Glue the branch over the top of the stem making sure you don't cover up any of your sentiment.
12. Glue the 6"x 2-3/4" piece of DSP to the flap of your envelope and trim around the edges.
13. See the pictures below for placement of your flowers.
