



Prep offers two standard diplomas and four college prep "track" diplomas. To be eligible for a College Prep Diploma, you must achieve a 3.0 GPA or higher. All diplomas offered meet or exceed most college entrance requirements. As the job market becomes more specialized, we believe that students should be encouraged to focus on their areas of interest with an end goal of a head start in their college major and future career (while still being well-rounded). To that end, we've created four College Prep "track" diplomas: Humanities, STEM, Arts, and Health Science. Note: If you are receiving a "track" diploma, it will be listed at the bottom of your transcript. Colleges will take note of the area of concentration by looking at the classes you took and you can make note of it on your college applications.

Track Diploma Requirements:

- 1. Students are required to complete all core classes for graduation (see table below). The classes listed under track specific diplomas are most closely related to each track and must be passed with a "C" grade or higher to remain eligible for that diploma. All other core classes required for graduation but not listed under each track must receive a passing grade to graduate but do not require a "C" or higher grade.
- 2. Participation in PUC's College Early program is assumed and an internship related to area of study is highly recommended
