Nursing Education/Clinical Internship Application for Admission 2025-2026

<u>Course Description</u>: Nursing Education is a capstone course designed to prepare students to pursue careers in the field of nursing. Upon completion of this course, students will be able to implement communication and interpersonal skills, maintain residents' rights and independence, provide care safely, prevent emergency situations, prevent infection through infection control, and perform the skills required of a nursing assistant. At the conclusion of this course, if students have logged 40 hours of classroom instruction and 20 hours of classroom clinical instruction, and if they have completed 40 hours of site- based clinical with at least 24 of those hours spent in a long-term care facility, then they are eligible to take the certification examination as a Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA)

Course Expectations:

- Students who are enrolled in Nursing Education are also required to enroll in Clinical Internship.

 These courses are scheduled in succession: 7 AM Nursing Education and 1st block Clinical Internship.
- Students selected for Nursing/Clinicals will complete clinical hours in a local long-term care facility and are expected to exhibit exceptional behavior and professionalism as representatives of Farragut High School in our community.
- Students are required to be present and on time to class. You are required to maintain a 90% attendance rate for this course (Knox County requirement for work-based learning courses).

<u>Additional Information</u>: The maximum number of students for each entering class is fifteen. Upon completion of this course, the student is eligible to sit for the State CNA Examination with the instructor's recommendation.

Admission Eligibility:

- 1. Student must be in 12th grade, and be 17 years old before or on the first day of class.
- 2. Student must show proof of health insurance.
- 3. Student must have a valid driver's license, car insurance, and be able to drive to the work-based learning site.
- 4. Original Social Security Card (must have to sit State CNA Exam).
- 5. Student must have a minimum GPA of 3.0
- 6. Student must have 90% attendance (tardies are also taken into consideration)
- 7. Student must have successfully completed all pre-requisites with a **minimum of B** (Health Science, Medical Therapeutics, and Anatomy & Physiology)
- 8. Student must disclose all school disciplinary actions. The course instructor and the principals will determine eligibility.
- 9. Student will submit a minimum 500 word typed essay outlining the reason the student believes this course will benefit their career trajectory.
- 10. 3 letters of recommendation from teachers (two academic teachers, 1 elective teacher) familiar with the student's performance and character.
