Dear NOMMA families,

At NOMMA, bullying of any kind, by any person, is unacceptable. We believe that bullying, intimidation, and harassment diminish a cadet's ability to learn and a school's ability to educate. Preventing cadets from engaging in these disruptive behaviors is an important school goal. The purpose of this letter is to provide you with information concerning NOMMA's anti-bullying program and to encourage you to help us identify cadets who bully or are being bullied.

Bullying is any behavior or pattern of behavior by a cadet, or a group of cadets, that is intended to harass, intimidate, ridicule, humiliate, or instill fear in another child or group of children. Bullying also includes unacceptable behavior identified in this policy which is electronically transmitted. Bullying behavior can be a threat of, or actual, physical harm or it can be verbal abuse of the child. Bullying is a series of recurring actions committed over a period of time directed toward one cadet or successive, separate actions directed against multiple cadets. Bullying, like other disruptive or violent behaviors, is conduct that disrupts both a cadet's ability to learn and the school's ability to educate its cadets in a safe environment.

Below are some of the signs that a young person could be subject to being bullied:

- Does not want to go to school and refuses to explain the reason
- Talks about not having any friends
- Has unexplained bruises, cuts, scratches, or abrasions
- Has unexplained damage to clothing, possessions, books, etc.
- Frequently loses money or possessions
- Loses interest in school and/or has declining grades
- Becomes withdrawn and/or has stress or depression symptoms

If you are aware or become aware of a cadet who you believe could be the subject of bullying conduct, please make a report to an Administrator. The Administrator will:

- Acknowledge and review your report.
- Treat your report with privacy and respect.
- Investigate your report. The school will not bring cadets who bully and those they bully into the same room to confront each other. All interviews will be private.
 - Take appropriate action that may include increased monitoring and supervision, restructuring schedules, additional resources, and disciplinary action for conduct code violations, among others, and provide you with feedback, if appropriate.
