Spanish Syllabus Señorita Davidson 2025-2026 School Year

Course Description:

Welcome to Spanish 2! You will continue to learn and expand your knowledge of the language. This course brings everything together from Spanish 1A and Spanish 1B. You will be expected to speak Spanish in class every day and fine-tune your communication skills. We will focus on vocabulary, grammar, speaking, reading, writing and listening skills. I do not expect you to be fluent, but I do expect you to try your best! If you need help or further practice, please come see me! Every student who actively participates and takes the class seriously will be successful!

Required Materials:

Chromebook (provided by school)

1 or 2 inch 3-ring binder (please no notebooks): must only be used for Spanish, not shared with other courses

Loose-leaf paper

Pencils/Pens

<u>Grades</u>: All grades are available to both students and parents in real time on SchoolTool (located on the school website).

- There will be two sections for assignments within the grade book:
 - 1. Summative assessments are worth 65%.
 - Examples: unit tests, quizzes, projects and other major performance tasks, etc.
 - 2. Formative assessments are worth 35%.
 - Examples: class participation, homework assignments, bell ringers, etc.
- The Final Exam is worth 15% of your overall average.
 - Students may retake quizzes as many times as needed.
 - All other graded work is final.
 - Extra credit opportunities will be allowed throughout the semester and are to be determined by teacher.
 - Late work will be accepted with points deducted each day it is late. Students with late or missing work will be expected in my class during activity period until completed. (Deductions of points will be waived due to extenuating circumstances).

Students must complete three units of foreign language in order to graduate with a Regents Diploma with Advanced Designation. This also includes passing the Checkpoint B exam with at least 65%

Homework Policy:

- Students will have minimal homework. Learning a new language is best done by practicing with other people. You will be responsible for reviewing vocabulary on your own.
- If homework is given, students are expected to complete it on time as a graded assignment.

Technology Policy:

• Every student is provided with a Chromebook for their classes and I utilize them almost daily. It is YOUR responsibility to bring them to class every day and ensure they are charged.

Academic Honesty Policy:

• Students will not engage in any form of academic dishonesty, whether by cheating, inappropriate collaboration on an assignment, or plagiarism - that is submitting, sharing or representing the work of others as their own including chatGPT, google translate and/or AI usage of any form. Per the code of conduct, if caught (upon 1st offense) the assignment will receive a grade of 60% credit. Upon second offense the assignment will receive 50% credit.

Cell Phone Policy:

- Students must keep devices in their lockers and out of sight.
 - 1st Offense: Device is taken and locked in the main office. The student picks it up at the end of the day. Parents are notified.
 - 2nd Offense: Same as above, plus a written referral and possible further discipline.
 - o 3rd Offense: Device is returned only to a parent/guardian after a meeting with the principal.
