These Bylaws are the traditional laws that DPS approves and were vetted by last year's MHS's CSC. Introductory items of CSC were explained (school members, community members, parents (currently missing). Primary items to discuss at the meeting: UIP (unified improvement plan), spending, budget, enhance student achievement and school culture.

Questions- Community member (Chris): Requested update on changes regarding hiring shifts. Wondering how the students and community members are feeling with new adjustments.?

New literacy department and literacy strategic plan was explained. Hiring of literacy interventionists, partnering with Lexia.

Question - Community member (Ariane -Denver Kid) After checking the bylaws is wondering about student voice in CSC and what we are doing as a school to incorporate a student.

CSU will bring this as an item for our next meeting to discuss with Mrs. Lynch.

-Class numbers (35 caps)

Facilitator explained DCTA regulations regarding class number was offered. Explained to committee that currently we have 1 class that is above the 35 cap. (Sports/PE credit

class 7th period). Roster is currently at 49 and is populated by student athletes as a support class to ensure students remain eligible. This class was approved by SLT last year.

Question by Community member (Chris): What time is period 7? Is there opportunity for other organizations to come in during that time period or after school?

The facilitator provided an explanation regarding the 7th period as it relates to the bell schedule. Mr. Wade was pointed as a contact person to get partnerships going. DSF was also presented as an additional partner to get workshops going (financial literacy). Community member is currently partnering with DSH members.

- -3 or more parents
 - -parents not in attendance, will be in future meetings
- -CSC discusses guidance to principal on spending, UIP, and anything else additional
- -main function is to enhance student achievement and our school culture
- -this committee provides strategic direction in support of mission, vision, UIP, etc.
- -budget presentation happens in the Spring
 - -committee approves or makes suggestions on shifting

Review roster verification process

- -major agenda item of night
- -per DCTA contract all classrooms must be 35 students or less with minimal exceptions
- -ALL classes are currently under 35 students with the exception of one class
 - -the one class with over 35 was approved by SLT in the spring, it is a PE class featuring Montbello athletes
 - -students are rostered at 49 but she does not see 49 every day
 - -this was approved by SLT and the teacher
 - -coaches pull students from this class
 - -students ineligible go to Mr. Cole for support
